Chart 1: Profile of the respondents

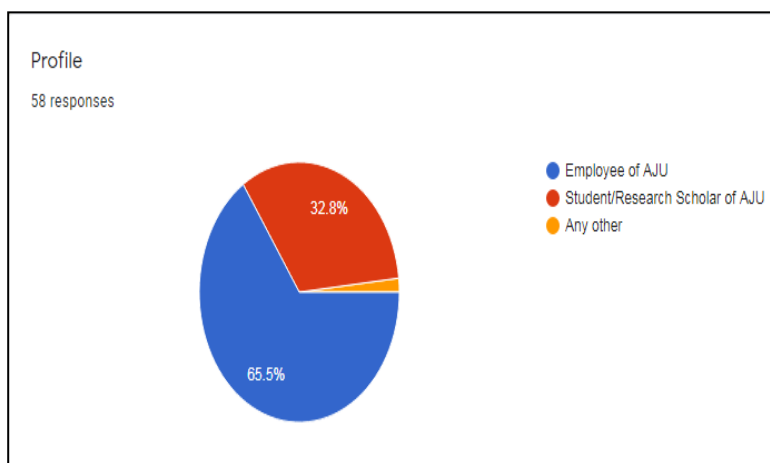


Chart 2: Responses on the statement 'Workshop Objectives were stated clearly and met'

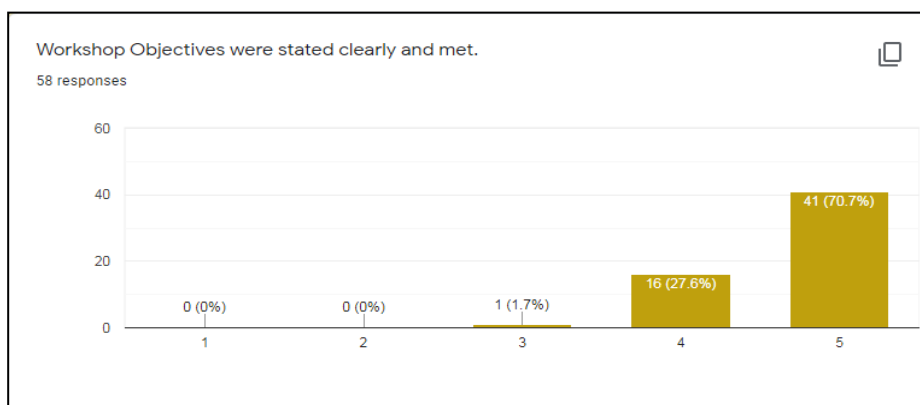


Chart 3: Responses on the statement ‘This workshop was well organised’

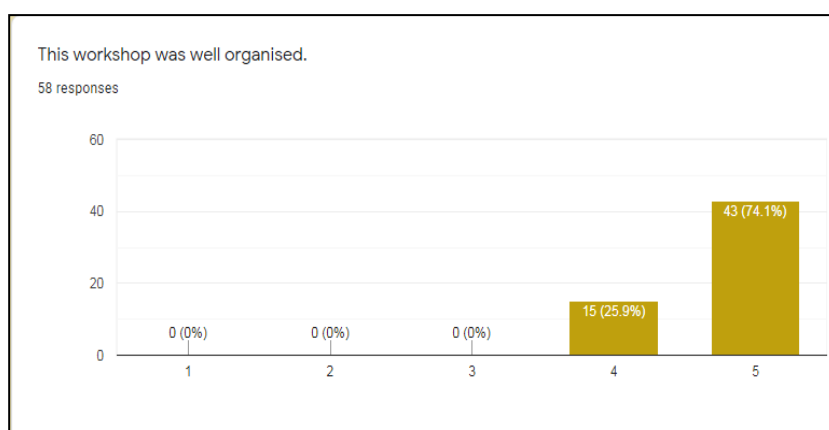


Chart 4: Responses on the statement ‘The information and/or skills presented were relevant and useful.’

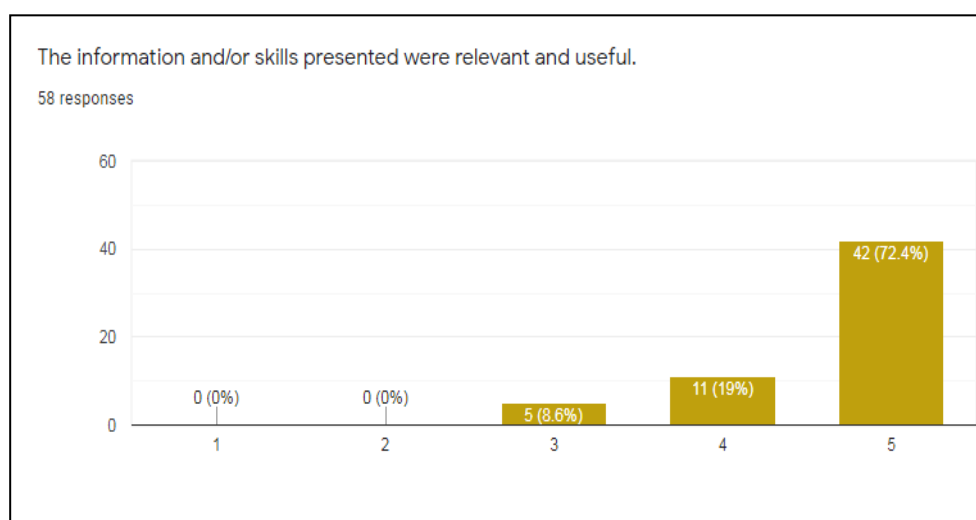


Chart 5: Responses on the statement ‘The presenter(s) provided adequate time for questions and answered them satisfactorily.’

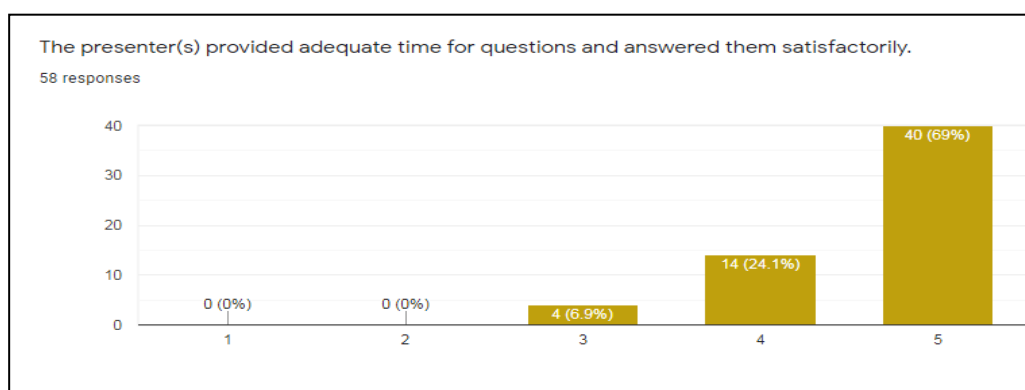


Chart 6: Responses on the statement ‘This workshop increased my knowledge and skills in developing Research Proposal

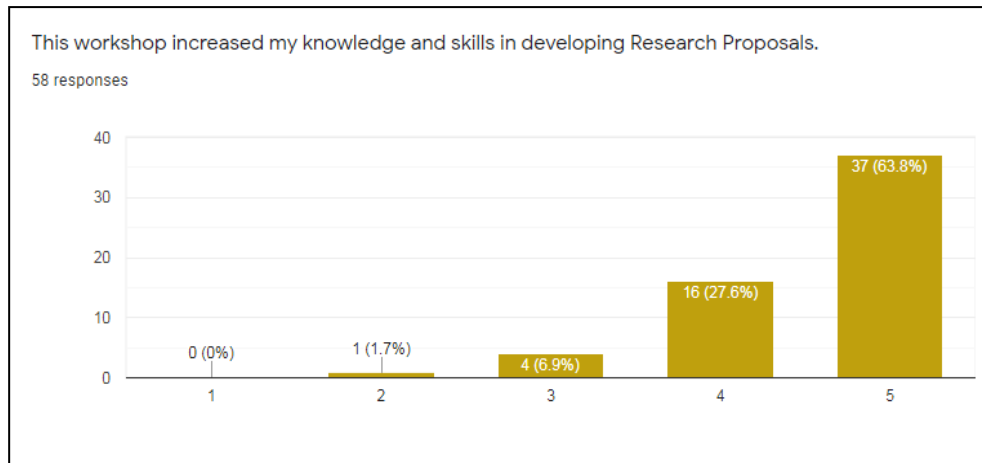


Chart 7: Responses on the statement “The workshop as presented was congruent with the workshop description.”

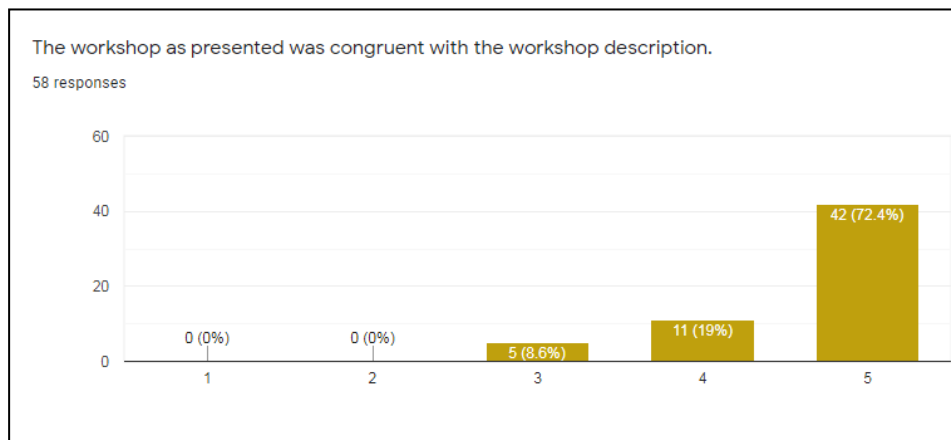
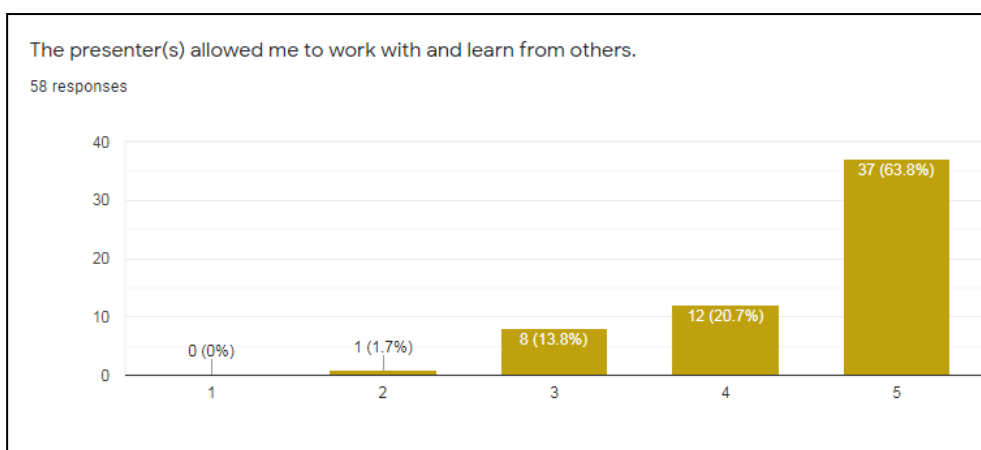


Chart 8: Responses on the statement ‘The presenter(s) allowed me to work with and learn from others.

Responses from the Employees of AJU (Faculty Members of School of Commerce & Management)
