
#### The key statements, quotes and points:

- The very first job always creates an impact in one's career journey.
- "If you have a plan, you will execute your own plan; if you don't, you will be executing someone else's plan."
- "Job satisfaction is a myth based on how one perceives it."
- Students must immediately start to jot down their short term and long term goals.
- They must work on the short term goals first in order to achieve their long term targets.
- He advised the students to plan a two to three years goal at the earliest and start working on it.
- One must have a plan, goal and determination first in order to do anything.
- The speaker also spoke on Employability Quotient and its significance.
- He said to the students to keep themselves updated and to keep learning continuously.
- He spoke on Ikigai (ee-key-guy) which is a Japanese concept that combines the terms iki, meaning "alive" or "life," and gai, meaning "benefit" or "worth." When combined, these terms mean that which gives your life worth, meaning, or purpose. Ikigai is similar to the French term "raison d'etre" or "reason for being."
- He posed a question to the students, "What differentiates a Good College Pass Out from Others?"
- He discussed the concept of knowledge and how it refers to familiarity with factual information and theoretical concepts. Skills, however, refer to the **ability to apply knowledge to specific situations**. Skills are developed through practice, through a combination of sensory input and output.
- He also discussed on "Why am I doing this?" vs "What I should do?"
- The distinguished speaker stressed on the importance of Resume. He told the students to prepare the resume well before hand, learn it well and correct all spellings and mistakes if there are any.
- He gave a tip to the student on **building the resume like a teaser** which would surely attract the employers.
- He asked the students to build their professional network slowly and steadily which would eventually help them in building a strong professional career journey.
- Students should focus on Industry Eminence Activities.
- He quoted "Experience is a collection of mistakes".
- He mentioned how making a mistake is totally fine. He said, "Make new mistakes again and again, but never repeat an old mistake again".
- He quickly asked the students to jot down some important points under Employability Quotient i.e.
  Attitude, Skills, Knowledge, Learning Ability, Soft Skills and Relevant Certifications.


#### PROGRAM


