ENSURING STUDENT ENGAGEMENT".

The occasion was graced by the presence of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor of the University, Dr. S.S. Razi.Prof.Damodar Acharya, Former Director, IIT Kharagpur and Former Chairman, AICTE, was the Chief Guest who addressed the audience with his views on 'Need and Rationale' of the FDP.Rightly pointed out by our Chief Guest ,the traditional teaching also known as Chalk and Talk enables an ecosystem for peer learning and self-development but thanks to the pandemic the entire teaching pedgogy changed overnight requiring a lot of graphic orientation.Dr.Arunava Narayan Mukherjee, Dean, School of Commerce and Management enlightened the participants on the 'Ethos of Teaching' where he integrated Swami Vivekananda's ideology in the present scenario helping the participants get a firm grip on the philosophical aspect of teaching.

The second session began with the topic 'Planning Digital Andragogy' by Prof. Neha Aggarwal where she threw light on the fact that adult learners are self motivated in nature and only focus on the information which they believe is useful to them which is why learning

outcomes should be discussed before starting a session. Session three was addressed by Dr. Charu Wadhwa and Prof. Ankita Singh on the topic 'Managing Student Engagement by Game based Learning' where in they gave noteworthy suggestions on how to create curiosity and excitement by integrating the learning aspect with a game and reiterated how students automatically assist themselves and learn through their own participation.

The fourth session was addressed by Dr. Pompi Das Sengupta and Prof. Abhishek Upadhyay on the topic 'The Road Ahead: Digital Heautagogy' who discussed about the background of Pedagogy, Andragogy and Heutagogy, the role of Andragogy and Heutagogy in E-Learning, Single and Double Loop Learning and its integration with SAMR model.

Professor and Head, Centre for Co-operative Management and Centre for Gender Studies Vaikunth Mehta National Institute of Cooperative Management.
