

Vice-Chancellor, AJU Prof. S. S. razi and DSW Dr. Angad Tiwary also addressed the audience.


Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, the event-coordinator and moderator of the said webinar, said that urban gentrification is a metaphor for a family crisis.
