AJU-NSS with its three units celebrated the 152nd birth anniversary of Gandhi ji and the second Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri in the university campus with great fervor and respect for the two great sons of the nation.

The three units of AJU-NSS took an initiative to organize a lecture session and planted at least 20 saplings in the campus in the presence of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) S. S. Razi, Director Mr. Amit Kumar Srivastav, Director (Campus) Dr. Angad Tiwari, the University NSS Coordinator Mr. Paras Nath Mishra, Program Officers, Mr. Rajiv Kumar Sinha, Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, and Ms. Purna Rai along with the NSS volunteers.

On the said occasion, Vice Chancellor Prof. S. S Razi said that Gandhi's and Shastri's contribution to the Indian freedom struggle is unparalleled, with Gandhi being the architect of several mass movements such as the Non-Cooperation Movement and the Civil Disobedience Movement.

Director, Amit Srivastava said that globally, Gandhi Jayanti is marked as the International Day of Non-Violence, after the United Nations General Assembly (UNGA) adopted a resolution on 15 June 2007. Gandhi's contribution to the propagation of non-violence or ahimsa is recognised by the global body on the occasion.

The Dean of Student's Welfare, Dr. Angad Tiwari explained the importance of Gandhi's contribution to propagate the ideal of non-violence that the UNGA resolution reaffirms the universal relevance of the principle of non-violence" and the desire to secure a culture of peace, tolerance, understanding and non-violence. In the program, Paras Nath Mishra, the NSS coordinator of the university, while delivering the welcome address said that the nation should be paramount for all the citizens and all should remember the contributions of the great heroes. The development of the nation cannot be stopped in any way by having such a feeling.

Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak told about the connections the two great personalities had with Jamshedpur in their times.
