The program was followed by Saraswati-Vandana. Event was Hosted by Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, Assistant Professor, Department of English, School of Humanities, ARKA JAIN University.

He talked about antibiotic resistance, targeted drug delivery system, artificial intelligence, personalised medicine regulatory authority etc.

Mr. Sumant Kumar Tiwari, Asst Director (Drugs) at Jharkhand Drugs Control Directorate, RCH Campus, Namkum, Ranchi, Jharkhand, India was Chief Guest for this conference.

In the end, Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak offered a vote of thanks. He thanked all the invited guests and participants for gracing the occasion by their solemn presence.

Plenary session: Day 1

The Planery session was started by Dr. (Mrs.) Krishnapriya Mohanraj, Professor of Pharmaceutical Analysis, Bombay College of Pharmacy, Kalina, Mumbai. She has her doctoral degree on the topic, **Isolation, Characterization and evaluation of Organic Molecules of Medicinal Interest**. She delivered her talk on a researcher insight to natural and Novel Pharmaceutical research. Speaking on that she told Historically, natural products (NP) development has been a field of immense interest to medical, commercial, and scientific communities worldwide. As isolation and purification techniques advanced, NP increasingly became prime candidates for drug leads and drug discovery efforts. Their diversity characterizes them as a virtually limitless source of novel lead compounds. She further said that the NPs offer special features in comparison with conventional synthetic molecules, which confer both advantages and challenges for the drug discovery process. NPs are characterized by enormous scaffold diversity and structural complexity. She discussed about Simple and Cost-Effective Synthesis of Sulfated β -Cyclodextrin and Its Application, Impurity profiling and a new paradigm in CAM angiogenesis model.

Dr. Ajay Semalty, Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences, H.N.B. Garhwal (Central) University Srinagar (Garhwal) addressed about **Improving Biopharmaceutical Properties of Synthetic and Herbal Drugs in Pharmaceutical Research**. He emphasized on Lipid-based drug delivery systems have been investigated in various studies and shown their potential in controlled and targeted drug delivery. He spoke about drug delivery system for various non-steroidal antiinflammatory drugs, proteins, cardiovascular and antineoplastic drugs. He also talked about OER, Plagiarism, MOOCs, nanotechnology etc.

Prof. Fatima May Tesoro, Dean at SAN PEDRO College, Davao del Sur, Davao Region, Philippines. She handled the third session on **Current trends in traction and screening using microwave assisted extraction and microwave assisted acid digestion**. In her talk, she said that quality analysis starts with great sample preparation, errors in chemical analysis, sample preparation for trace analysis and temperature control. She also discussed about regulatory requirements for safety assessment of herbal medicines.

Last talk of the plenary session was by Mr. Saravana Kumar, Corporate QA Head, Fourrts (India) Laboratories Pvt Ltd. Tamil Nadu, India. He is a post graduate in pharmacy, having about 25 years of experience in pharmaceutical industry, Graduated from Madurai Medical College and post graduation from BITS, Pliani. He had completed course on Quality Management from National Institute for Quality & Reliability and Advanced Program on Pharmaceutical Quality Management from NSF (UK). He delivered his talk on topic **Modern approach in Leveraging Herbal Medicines**. He explained about research on Herbal Medicines, Technology oriented approach. He highlighted several plant natural products that are either in the clinic or currently under active research and clinical development, with particular emphasis on their mechanisms of action. He also emphasized about recent efforts in developing modern multi-herb prescriptions through rigorous molecular-level investigations and standardized clinical trials. He also discussed about Emerging technologies, such as genomics and synthetic biology, are enabling new ways for discovering and utilizing the medicinal properties of plants. We are entering an exciting era where the ancient wisdom distilled into the world's traditional herbal medicines can be reinterpreted and exploited through the lens of modern science.

Plenary session: Day 2

The chief Guest for second day event was Revered Ranjit Barshikar, CEO- QbD International QbD/cGMP Consulting, United Nations Adviser Geneva. He kept his session on **Current Scenario / Future challenges**. In his talk, he said that the Indian pharmaceutical industry has contributed immensely not just to Indian but to global healthcare outcomes. India continues to play a material role in manufacturing various critical, high- quality and low-cost medicines for Indian and global markets. In the current Scenario the demand of medicines is increasing day by day, so the employment in pharma sector is also rising.Followed by Dr. Nagaraj Rao, Managing Director, Rane Rao Reshamia Laboratories Pvt Ltd, Navi Mumbai, India (MOU Partner). He discussed about **Novelty in Vaccines Developed in India**.

Dr. Mona Semalty, Co-Coordinator University SWAYAM Cell, Assistant Professor, Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences, H.N.B. Garhwal (Central) University Srinagar (Garhwal) addressed about **Herbal hair growth promotion research**. She highlighted the developments in hair rejuvenation strategies and the potential of herbal drugs as safer and effective alternatives.

She also discussed about various causes for hair loss and treatments offered include both natural or synthetic products to treat the condition of hair loss (alopecia). Natural products are continuously gaining popularity mainly due to their fewer side effects and better formulation strategies for natural product extracts. Plants have been widely used for hair growth promotion since ancient times as reported in Ayurveda, Chinese and Unani systems of medicine. She also gave information about different herbs and herbal formulation that are believed to be able to reduce the rate of hair loss and at the same time stimulate new hair growth.

Fourth session was by Prof. Joseph Mari B. Querequincia, Associate Prof. Faculty, Pharmacy Department, San Pedro College, Philippines. He deliverd his talk on **Pharmacognostic and hypoglycemic evaluation of Artocarpus odoratissimus Blanco (Moraceae) fruit**. He talked about Polyphenolic chemicals are found in the majority of Artocarpus plant species. Artocarpus odoratissimus Blanco is a natural plant species of the genus. Its therapeutic benefits are supported by scant scientific data. The preliminary toxicity and hypoglycemic properties of Artocarpus odoratissimus dichloromethane semi-crude fruit extract were examined in his study. He closed the seminar by stating that extract sample possess hypoglycemic activity through rodent animal models.

Last session was chaired by Dr. Ajit Kumar Thakur, Assistant Professor, Delhi Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Research University on the topic **Beneficial effect of Glycyrrhiza glabra Linn. Extracts on learning & memory in Stress-Triggered Rats.** He discussed potential uses of Glycyrrhiza glabra for antitumor, antimicrobial, antiviral, anti-inflammatory, immunoregulatory, and several other activities that contribute to the recovery and protection of the nervous, alimentary, respiratory, endocrine, and cardiovascular systems. He also summarized about potential therapeutic activities and traditional uses of Glycyrrhiza glabra Linn. He showed the results of comparative effect of Glycyrrhiza glabra extracts viz. flavonoid rich (GGFE) and glycyrrhizin rich (GGGE) in stress triggered rats and to provide future research insight for this herbal drug. He explained about both extracts of Glycyrrhiza glabra (GGFE and GGGE) possess memory enhancing property in stress triggered rats. Moreover, these comparative results provided information and confirmed the high potential of GGGE in comparison to GGFE might be due to rich glycyrrhizin content present in GGGE responsible for acetylcholinesterase and antioxidant enzyme modulatory activity. He stressed on GGGE could be used as a promising lead for further mechanistic and molecular study for defining the role of glycyrrhizin of Glycyrrhiza glabra.

Plenary session: Day 3

Session was started with address by Mr. Kaushik Desai, Secretary General, International Pharmaceutical Excipients Council of India (IPEC India). He is Secretary General with two Indian arms of International Associations namely, International Pharmaceutical Excipients Council of India (IPEC India) and Health Foods and Dietary Supplements Association of India (HADSA). He is also Advisor of Indian Pharma Manufacturers' Association (IPMMA). He delivered his talk on Natural product research, drug delivery system. He emphasized on development of soft skill, networking, and advancement of qualifications. He closed his presentation by stating that India will gain an advantage over the rest of the globe via joint efforts and an integrated strategy to research in innovative medicine delivery methods for natural products.

First Session was by Dr. Vandana B. Patravale, Professor of Pharmaceutics at the Institute of Chemical Technology, Mumbai, India. She has around 30 years of teaching and research experience. She has over 200 refereed publications with over 8277 citations (H index 46, i10 111), 20 granted patents, 22 patents in pipeline and 2 trademark registries. She has published 2 books and 25 book chapters with international publishers. Her areas of research include development of nanocarriers with major emphasis on infectious diseases, cancer and neurodegenerative disorders; medical device development, nanodiagnostics and nanovaccines. She is actively collaborating with researchers as well as industries within country and abroad and has completed Indo-Swiss, Indo-Japan, Indo-UK projects. She is executing all major grants from Indian Government focusing on product development. She has transferred about 20 technologies to industry including drug eluting stents being marketed in more than 65 countries. She delivered her talk on topic Nanotechnology in Healthcare: From bench side to bedside. She started her presentation with global examples of Emerging and Re-emerging Infectious diseases. She also covered about challenges to tackle drug resistance, occupational exposure, social stigma, lack of medical counter measures. She discussed about Brucellosis, formulation and characterization of Nanovaccine, Nanostructured lipid carriers-based combination therapy for cerebral malaria activity. She talked about her patent Immuno-chromographic diagnostic test based on Fluroscence Silica Nanosensors.

Second session by Prof. Erwin M. Faller, Professor, Pharmacy Department, San Pedro College on Tropical Skin Ulcer: A search for Novel Natural Products. The last session of third day event was ended with the talk of Dr. Amber Vyas, Assistant Professor, University Institute of Pharmacy, Pandit Ravishankar Shukla University, Raipur, Chhattisgarh, India on Exploring Natural Products for Drug Discovery and Development. He spoke about Natural products have traditionally played an important role in human medicine, representing a vast pool of bioactive chemical variety and aiding in the understanding of cellular pathways, which are critical components of the drug development process. He discussed how drug discovery research must produce strong and viable lead compounds that go from a screening hit to a drug candidate by structural elucidation and structure identification via GC–MS, NMR, IR, HPLC, and HPTLC. The emergence of new technologies has transformed the screening of natural products in the search for novel medications. Utilizing these technologies allows us to conduct research in screening novel compounds using software and databases in order to establish natural products as a key source of drug discovery.

The entire three days event was inaugurated with Saraswati Vandana and Spiritual Lamp Lighting and ended with National anthem of both country. The Last day vote of thanks was given by Mr. Sumanta Sen, Associate Professor, School of Pharmacy.

Scientific session: Day 3

The value of sharing knowledge as a basis for establishing trust, building collaboration and mutual understanding and avoiding conflict was emphasised as one of the most important conclusions of the conference. It was also seen as a key to accomplishing the social responsibilities, for making difficult decisions as well as cultural exchange and development of joint research activities these kind of collaborative activities are quite useful.
