Razi, Dr. Jyotirmaya Sahoo, Dean School of Health & Allied Science, Teaching and non-teaching staff of School of Pharmacy. Dr. Jyotirmaya Sahoo presented the workshop. He explained all detail about the revised syllabus. He said that

- E. R. 2020 for Diploma Course In Pharmacy has notified in the gazette of India dated 16th October 2020.
- Approved by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of India.
- Further the revised syllabus approved and implemented by Pharmacy council of India under regulation 7 on 23rd Sept 2021 and made forceful for its implementation for 2021-2022 academic session.
- Candidate shall have passed 10+2 examination conducted by the respective state/central government authorities recognized as equivalent to 10+2 examination by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU) with English as one of the subjects and Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics (P.C.M) and or Biology (P.C.B / P.C.M.B.) as optional subjects individually. Any other qualification approved by the Pharmacy Council of India as equivalent to any of the above examinations.
- Two years full time regular course.
 - 1st Year
 - 2nd Year
- Pattern of Examination: Annual
- Preferred Medium Instruction and examination shall be in English.
- 1st Year: 1000 marks (500 marks Theory + 500 marks Practical)
- 2nd Year: 1100 marks (600 marks Theory + 500 marks Practical)
- 180 working days
- 75% attendance minimum
- Practical training of 500 hours spread over a period of not less than three months.
- After the final year examination of B. Pharm 2nd Year.
- Candidate shall be eligible to undergo practical training in
 - (i) Hospitals/Dispensaries run by Central/State Gov

- (ii)A Pharmacy, Chemist and Druggist licensed under the Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945 made under the D&C Act, 1940 (23 of 194).
- In the course of practical training, the trainee shall have exposure to
- Working knowledge of
 - Keeping of records required by various Acts concerning the profession of Pharmacy, and Practical experience in-
 - The manipulation of pharmaceutical apparatus.
 - The reading, translation and copying of prescription including checking of doses.
 - The dispensing of prescription.
 - Storage of drugs and medical preparations.
- Sessional Examination of 20% for theory
- Two or more sessional examinations for Theory papers
- Duration 90 minutes
- Highest aggregate of any two performances will be the basis of calculation.
- Total 40 marks of questions (Long answer 3 out of 4=15, short answers 5 out of 6= 15, MCQ/FB=10. Total=40.
- The marks secured by the students out of the total 40 shall be reduced to 20.
- The internal assessment shall be calculated based on the best two averages for 20 marks.
- **Sessional Examination For Practical**
- 20% Sessional
- Two or more sessional examinations for Practical papers
- Duration 180 minutes
- Highest aggregate of any two performances will be the basis of calculation.
- Total 80 marks of questions (Synopsis=10, Experiments 50, Viva=10, Practical Record Maintenance=10. Total=80).
- The marks secured by the students out of the total 80 shall be reduced to 10 as sessional marks.
- Assignments=5 marks
- Field Visit =5 marks#
- Sessional =10 marks
- The internal assessment shall be calculated based on the best two averages for 20 marks.

- Duration 180 minutes
- Total 80 marks of questions (Long answer 6 out of 7=30, short answers 10 out of 11= 30, MCQ/FB=20. Total=80.
- **Final Year Examination For Practical**
- 80% Final Examination
- Duration 180 minutes
- Total 80 marks of questions (Synopsis=10, Experiments 60, Viva=10, Practical Record Maintenance=10. Total=80).
- * Sessional Exam 20+Final Exam 80=100 marks.
- Pass %=50%
- 1st Division=60%

- Distinction= 75% (provided all subjects need to pass in single attempt).
