It is 2-day colorful event in which various events and competitions for the students between inter school. Also, the School of Law enthusiastically organized to encourage the student to show their talent on various platforms and was “Debate Competition” one of the events.

**About the Event:**

The sequence for debate, with suggested timelines, is as follows:

1. Any participating team shall consist of at least 2 Members. Maximum 5 teams from any school of the university.
2. Each team shall get maximum 6 minutes that may be extended to 8 minutes with prior permission of judges. Any extension in without prior permission of judges will lead to deduction of marks. In case any team exceeds 8 minutes that may lead to disqualification.
3. The first speaker on the affirmative team presents arguments in support of the resolution. (3 minutes)
4. The first speaker on the opposing team presents arguments opposing the resolution. (3 minutes)
5. The second speaker on the affirmative team may present further arguments in support of the resolution, identifies areas of conflict, and answers questions that may have been raised by the opposition speaker. (3 minutes)
6. The second speaker on the opposing team may present further arguments against the resolution, identifies further areas of conflict, and answers questions that may have been raised by the previous affirmative speaker. (3 minutes)

7. No rebuttal for any team is allowed.
8. There cannot be any interruptions. Speakers must wait for their turns. The judges may need to enforce the rules.
9. Marks may be awarded as per the following criteria out of the marks allocated against each category.
10. Marking Criteria Number of Marks- Total 100 Marks
  - i. Contents / substance- 25 Marks
  - ii. Oratory skills- 25 Marks
  - iii. Presentation skills- 20 Marks
  - iv. Clarity of thought- 20 Marks
  - v. Confidence- 10 Marks
11. The average of the marks awarded by all judges shall be calculated. The average marks thus calculated shall be the final score for a particular candidate on the basis of which the highest scorer will be declared winner, second & third highest scorers will be declared as first and second runner-up of the event.
12. All decisions by the organising committee and judges shall be considered final.
