ABOUT THE EVENT:


Three panellists joined us virtually on the Google meet platform. Our panellist was Ms Rikta Paul (Asst.Prof IIMT University, Meerut, PhD scholar at C T University), Mrs Akansha Gupta (Faculty and Consultant Optometrist, C L Gupta Eye Institute, Moradabad) and Ms Nikhita Jacob (Faculty, Sankara College of Optometry; Bengaluru). The session was attended by internal students as well as students from various other colleges and practicing optometrists. The discussion addressed the various problems that women face in health care service delivery, ocular hygiene maintenance and how hormones' alteration causes disturbances in ocular physiology.

TAKEAWAY (OUTCOME):

The awareness was created regarding gender specific diseases. A little more awareness is required among women on how make up products change ocular surface dynamics and cause certain conditions like MGD and dry eye. Hormonal changes that occur during pregnancy, menopause etc., also cause alteration in ocular biochemistry, so specific care should be given to the nutrient intake. Ignorance with cosmetic contact lenses is also a major crisis among women who are not aware of the dos and donts of contact lens routine.


