


Report on- A SESSION ON PREPARATION OF HERBARIUMS Held on - 04/03/2023

OBJECTIVE: A herbarium is essentially an organized library of dried plant specimens. The herbarium is a storehouse of plant materials with valuable data mentioned on their labels. The material in the herbarium remains as permanent record of flora of those regions even the natural topography and the vegetation have changed or extinct.

DETAILS: On 4th March 2023 the students from different courses of Pharmacy and specifically from 4th semester have undergone a session on Preparation of Herbariums. A herbarium is a collection of preserved plant specimens and related information which is used for scientific study and research. Use of herbarium is to Authentic and correct recognition of plant species. Herbariums provide information about the flora and fauna of a particular ecosystem. It also provides instant referrals in taxonomic studies. Students of School of Pharmacy were trained to prepare herbariums on the leaves of various plants. A good number of students from 4th semester B. Pharmacy participated in this session. The session was quite interesting for the students. They showed their interest to participate, if such kind of training programs will be conducted in future. Session was guided by Dr Jyotirmaya Sahoo and supported by Mr Alok Kumar Moharana, Mr Sumanta Sen, Mr Asutosha Parida, Mr Dusmanta Mahanta and Miss Priyabati.





For the preparation of mounted herbarium-specimens different important steps include: a. Poisoning, b. Pressing, c. Drying, d. Mounting, e. Stitching, f. Labelling, g. Identification. Poisoning is generally done by dipping the whole plant in a saturated solution of mercuric chloride in ethyl alcohol. Placing the specimens between the absorbents under heavy pressure is the next step of preparation of herbarium. The Plants should be placed in the press and be tightened. The faster the drying, greater will be the quality of the dried specimen. After the specimen is pressed, dried and poisoned, it is affixed along with a label on a mounting sheet. The mounting sheets are made from heavy long-lasting white card sheet in uniform size of 28 x 42 cm. The stitching should be small and independent and thread should not be carried from one stitch to another on the lower side of the mounting sheet. After the mounting of specimens on the herbarium sheets, the pasting of herbarium labels is done on the sheets.

OUTCOMES: Specimens in herbaria are very useful to identify plants growing here or elsewhere. Plant specimens preserved in an herbarium represent the best record of the plant's original distribution.




