This day also fosters cultural diversity, which strengthens relationships and peace.

ABOUT THE EVENT:

Every year on March 21, UNESCO celebrates World Poetry Day. Adopted in 1999, the occasion honours poets and pays tribute to expanding linguistic variety and sharing oral traditions through poetic forms. Poetry is believed to have originated thousands of years ago and has been kept alive through oral and written forms.

The day encourages people to understand the importance of poetic devices and increases the opportunity for endangered languages to be heard. Reading poetry helps children about voice, pitch, volume, and inflection. While these are mainly functions of speech, they're also incredibly important for children learning to read. Poetry can teach young readers about speech patterns, which can give those cues to the words on a page.

The students of Batch 2022, BA English (H), read their choice poems and celebrated the joy of knowing poetry and its depth of learning. The class activity was conducted by Dr Rupa Sarkar for the subject, Indian English Literature.




TAKEAWAY (OUTCOME):


