Two-Day International Conference on Peripheral Writings

The Department of English organized a two-day virtual international conference on 'Peripheral Writings: Reflections on New Power, Hierarchies and Norms' from 24th 25th Februrary'2022. It aimed to explore the peripheral existence, marginalization, tenuous position and lack of belongingness and survivalist strategies faced by the Colonial Countries and underprivileged section. It was deliberated that the feeling of being excessively scrutinized and marginalized is common especially amongst women and the subjugated lot who are constantly deprived of their rights. Issues pertaining to peripheral existence, Dilemma and conflicts, life in exile, Diaspora understanding of centre and periphery, lack of support and access to resources was identified and discussed. The conference aimed to describe how these un-

derprivileged section negotiate their experiences of work and how they feel damaged by their experiences. The conference concluded by making institutional change in the present scenario for broadened horizon.

The keynote speakers were Sibghat Usmani from North America, Syed Zamant Abbas from Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Dr. Shakibur Rahman from Jamshedpur, Dr. Saba Praveen, Delhi University, and Prof. Mandakini Bhattacharya from Kolkata.
