



**Objective:** The Induction Programs core purpose is to familiarize students with institution rules and academic standards, build relationships with peers and faculty, foster a love for learning, empower them to handle peer pressure, promote empathy and sincerity.

Details: The primary goal of the Induction Program is to facilitate the smooth adjustment and comfort of new students in their new environment, while also introducing them to the institution's culture. The Induction Program offers crucial information such as class schedules, practical sessions, uniforms, institutional policies, and various academic and non-academic activities. This year the induction program of School of Pharmacy AARAMBH 2023 began from 5th august 2023 and lasted till 22nd august 2023. It was jointly organized by the School of Pharmacy and the Institute Industry Interaction Cell (IIIC), in partnership with ARKA JAIN University and IQAC through their MoU, the event featured esteemed professionals from both Industry and Academia. The week-long program not only provided students with powerful insights from dynamic experts but also energized them for the journey ahead. The event commenced with lamp lighting conducted by the honorable Vice Chancellor of Arka Jain University, Dr. S.S. Razi. The ceremony was graced by the presence of esteemed guests including Dr. Jyotirmaya Sahoo, Jasbir Singh Dhanjal, Dr. Angad Tiwari, Deans of various Schools and departments, along with the dedicated teaching and non-teaching staff members. In a symbolic gesture, green pots were offered to the guests, symbolizing growth and new beginnings. In his address, the Vice Chancellor, Dr. S.S. Razi, inspired the incoming students with a motivating speech. He emphasized that great heights can be achieved even in adverse circumstances, as long as one remains steadfast in their goals. Dr. Jyotirmaya Sahoo, the Dean of the School of Pharmacy, provided an insightful introduction to ARKA JAIN University and specifically the School of Pharmacy. This was followed by a captivating dance performance by Shreya. The session continued with a presentation of a video showcasing the essence of the steel city followed by a concise overview of the institute's vision and mission. The event then shifted focus to the pharmaceutical sector, with several esteemed resource persons sharing their insights.

Their talks revolved around the career prospects and future scope for pharmacy graduates in India. The day's proceedings were seamlessly managed under the guidance of Dr. Shweta, who ensured smooth connectivity and coordination with the resources. The second day commenced with Yoga and Meditation session, led by Mr. Ashutosha. Continuing the day's events, Prof. Dr. Amiyakanta Mishra, Professor and Principal at CPS, Puri, Odisha, and Dr. Erwin Faller, Director and Professor at the Faculty of Pharmacy, San Pedro College, Philippines, took the stage. Their engaging talks echoed the previous day's discussions, centering around the promising career prospects and future opportunities for pharmacy graduates in India. Under the guidance of Dr. Shweta, the day's proceedings maintained a seamless flow, ensuring smooth connectivity and coordination with the distinguished resource persons. An important segment followed, acknowledging accomplishments of students who successfully qualified the GPAT and NIPER examinations. Alongside this, a selected group of teachers received recognition for their selfless dedication, contributing significantly to the reputation of the department and the university as a whole. This segment was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Kirtimaya Mishra. The subsequent session centered around an Alumni Talk, facilitated by Mr. Alok Mohrana. The session served to motivate upcoming batches. The program then moved on to providing insights into various university events held throughout the year, including Aagaz, Aarambh, Navotsav, Roshni, RunBhoomi, Holi Invasion, and Caarvan. Miss Priyabati eloquently detailed each event, offering a glimpse into the vibrant campus life and diverse activities that students could eagerly anticipate. The day commenced with Dr. Priyambada Sarangi, Director of Holy Grace Academy of Pharmacy in Mala, Thrissur, Kerala. She outlined the diverse opportunities available worldwide. The session continued with Dr.Charu Wadha, who spoke about Gender Sensitization and ICC (Internal Complaint Committee). She enlightened the students that gender sensitization in colleges is not just a matter of compliance with legal frameworks but a significant step toward societal progress. The next session was conducted by Miss Priyabati, who spoke about the Code and Conduct of the University. Student's Conduct & Discipline Rules have been framed for the benefit of the students and the proper functioning of the University. The session continued with detailed information on the CODE OF CONDUCT, detailing the Disiciple one needs to maintain within the campus, uniform, timing, and other necessary details. The session was followed by a talent hunt organized by Mr. Sumanta Sen. Fresher's participated and showcased their talents, including dance, singing, and recitation. Later, Dr. Jyotirmaya Sahoo conducted a session on Human values, emphasizing their importance in fostering character development, ethical decision-making, and positive relationships. He also discussed various career opportunities available in different sectors of the pharmaceutical industry. Following this insightful session, the students were instructed to attend the AARAMBH 2023 celebration at LOYOLA School along with their parents. The National Service Scheme plays a pivotal role in college students' lives, offering them a unique opportunity to blend academic learning with real-world experiences. By participating in NSS, students lay the foundation for a brighter future for themselves and their communities. The session was conducted by Mr. Paras Nath Mishra, NSS coordinator, who spoke about the significance of NSS in students lives. Moving on with the days session, a few fun activities were arranged for the students, where the freshers, along with the seniors, participated in teams. Events like tug of war, Musical chairs, Sack race, Spoon balancing, and Dumb Charades were conducted and coordinated by Miss Purnima Mahato. The students thoroughly enjoyed the session. The day began with a visit to nearby villages by the freshers, coordinated by Mr. Ashutosha and Miss Purnima. The students were taken to Mohanpur and Musri Kudar, where they were allowed to freely interact with the villagers. It was a two-way communication process, during which the villagers shared their experiences and the special bond they share with the students of Arka Jain University. After returning, the students, along with their seniors, participated in an Anti-Ragging Nukkad Natak event. Considering the importance of addressing the topic of anti-ragging in college life, the students collectively pledged to fight against ragging and create a ragging-free environment on campus. Following this, a rules and regulations session was conducted by Dr. Babita Sarangi. Afterward, a brief introduction to the Pharma club named "Bhesajam" was given by Miss Purnima. The main motto of BHESAJAM is to spread awareness about mental and physical health, considering the changes in daily work habits and routines. "BHESAJAM" also promotes the commitment to organize activities that advocate for the role of pharmacists in improving health. Furthermore, a sports session was conducted by Mr. Amit Kumar Singh, focusing on providing comprehensive knowledge about the different sports activities that take place within the university. The session covered various types of sports events that occur annually at the university. It also provided detailed information on various sports such as cricket, basketball, football, volleyball, badminton, chess, and table tennis that are played on campus.A Toastmaster session was conducted by Miss Rajkumari Ghosh. 


