**Objective:** On the 6th of February 2023, the School of Engineering and IT organized an event to commemorate the International Day of Zero Tolerance for Female Genital Mutilation, declared by the World Health Organization. The objective of the event was to create awareness about the negative effects of Female Genital Mutilation (FGM) and encourage women in nearby villages to openly discuss their health problems and overall well-being.

The event served as a catalyst for the villagers to actively participate in finding solutions to the challenges posed by FGM.
