# **INFRASTRUCTURE**






Fig 4.5 Awareness programme on child marriage and education through puppet show at Mohanpur village was organized by Department Of Journalism and Mass Communication




Fig 4.16 NCC cadets of Arka Jain University in annual training camp




Fig 5.21 Pottery Art during pottery competition in the campus




Fig 9.1 Counselling Centre of AJU






Fig 9.2 Sitting arrangement of Counselling Centre at AJU


