OBJECTIVE: The Human Rights Day Online Expert Lecture aimed to educate, raise awareness, and foster discussions on the significance of human rights, their protection, and the global challenges faced in ensuring justice and equality for all. DETAILS: On December 18, 2024, the School of Engineering & IT at ARKA JAIN University organized an Expert Lecture on Human Rights Day to educate students and faculty

members on the significance of human rights and their impact on society. The event was conducted in an online mode via Google Meet, ensuring accessibility to a wide audience. The distinguished speaker for the session was Ms. Promila Mukherjee, Legal Assistant at Bharat Petroleum Corporation Ltd., who shared her extensive knowledge and insights on various aspects of human rights, legal frameworks, and the challenges of ensuring justice in contemporary society. The event was successfully coordinated by Prof. Taniya Ghosh, Assistant Professor, Department of Electrical and Electronics Engineering, School of Engineering & IT. The lecture covered a broad spectrum of topics related to human rights, including their historical development, the fundamental principles outlined in international human rights charters, and the responsibilities of governments and civil societies in upholding these rights. The interactive nature of the lecture made it an enriching experience, allowing students to not only gain theoretical knowledge but also develop a practical understanding of the importance of human rights in everyday life.

OUTCOMES: The Expert Lecture on Human Rights Day had a profound impact on students and faculty members, fostering a deeper understanding of human rights principles and their relevance in modern society. One of the primary outcomes was the enhanced awareness and knowledge among participants regarding the fundamental rights enshrined in international human rights declarations. They gained insights into civil, political, economic, social, and cultural rights, understanding how these rights contribute to ensuring dignity, equality, and freedom for all individuals. The lecture significantly raised awareness about current human rights challenges, allowing students to explore ongoing violations, such as discrimination, gender-based violence, censorship, and refugee crises. By examining real-world examples, participants developed a critical perspective on global issues, enabling them to analyze the root causes of human rights abuses and explore potential solutions to address these pressing concerns. Another key outcome was the stimulation of critical thinking and ethical reflection among students. By understanding the importance of activism, legal frameworks, and the role of civil society in defending human rights, participants were motivated to engage in awareness campaigns, volunteer for human rights organizations, and explore career paths related to law, policymaking, and social justice. They also learned about opportunities for internships, research, and collaborations with organizations dedicated to protecting human rights. The session also provided a valuable networking platform, allowing students to connect with experts, faculty members, and peers who share an interest in human rights. This engagement opened doors for future collaborations, knowledge-sharing, and participation in human rights initiatives at both national and international levels. By interacting with professionals working in the field, students were inspired to think about how they can contribute to creating a more just and equitable society through their academic pursuits and career choices. Additionally, the lecture fostered a sense of social responsibility among attendees, encouraging them to become more mindful of their roles as global citizens. 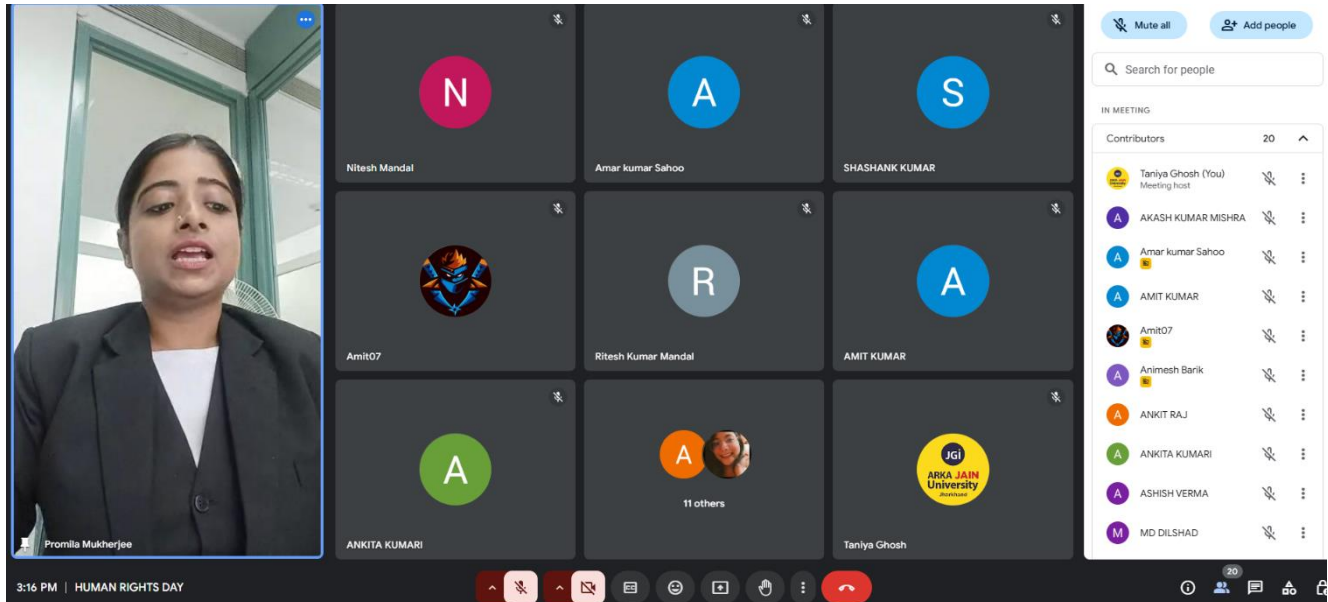


FIGURE 1: SCREENSHOT OF THE EXPERT LECTURE: HUMAN RIGHTS DAY

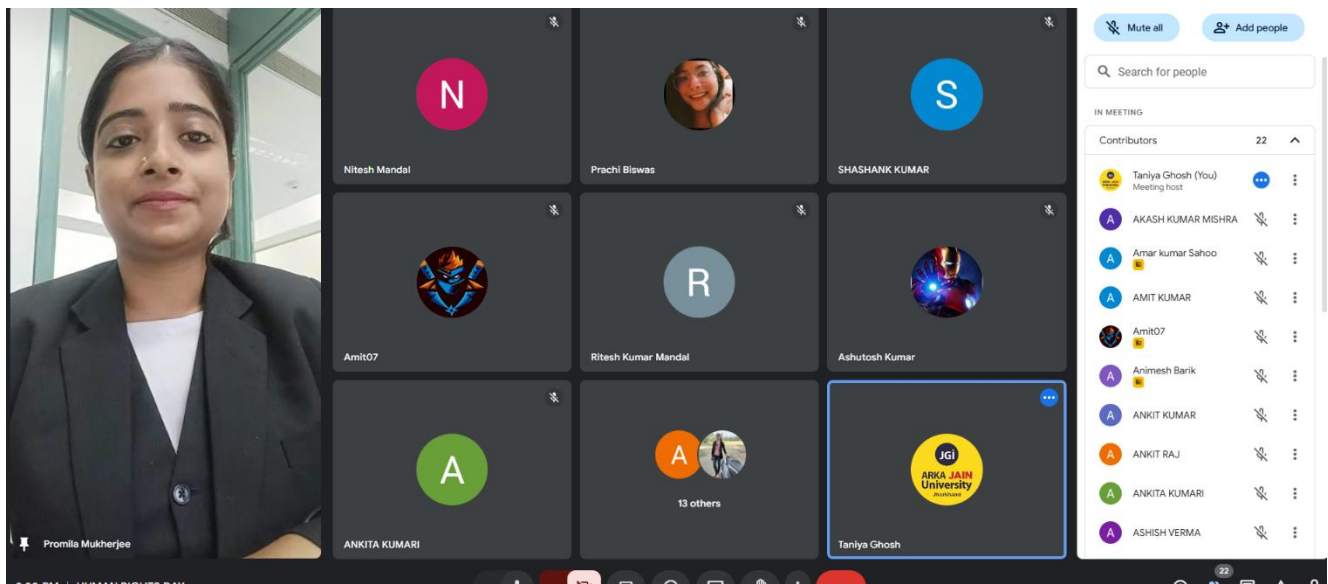


FIGURE 2: SCREENSHOT OF THE EXPERT LECTURE: HUMAN RIGHTS DAY
