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

OBJECTIVE:

The primary objective of the one-day seminar on **"World Patient Safety Day - Get it Right, make it Safe"** was to raise awareness about the critical importance of patient safety in healthcare settings. The event aimed to educate healthcare professionals on the latest knowledge and best practices, foster a culture of safety within healthcare organizations, and highlight the global significance of World Patient Safety Day. Additionally, it sought to create a platform for knowledge exchange among professionals, promote the implementation of effective safety protocols and error reporting systems, and advocate for patient-centered care approaches that prioritize the safety and well-being of patients in all healthcare processes and decisions.

ABOUT THE EVENT:

On 30 September 2024, the event commenced with welcome session and the lamp lighting by the dignitaries and faculty members, followed by inaugural address from Mr. Sarbojeet Goswami, HOD, Department of Optometry, School of Health and Allied Science who underscored the global relevance of World Patient Safety Day and the critical need for integrating safety practices into healthcare operations.

The session featured a comprehensive session by Ms. Clerita Serrao, Central Optometry Trainer, Lenskart Academy, Mumbai, who joined virtually to discuss "Eye Safety". Her presentation included detailed safety precautions to prevent eye injuries

and infections at work. Ms. Serrao emphasized the significance of using protective eye wear tailored to different medical procedures, highlighting that proper eye protection can drastically reduce the risk of exposure on hazardous materials and infections.

Ms. Serrao elaborated on the importance of proper sanitation techniques, such as the regular cleaning and disinfection of protective eyewear and workspaces to prevent cross-contamination. She also stressed the need for regular eye examinations for healthcare workers to detect and address any vision problems early, ensuring that they can perform their duties safely and effectively. By sharing real-life case studies, Ms. Serrao demonstrated the positive impact of stringent eye safety protocols on reducing workplace injuries and enhancing patient care. Her presentation provided actionable insights that healthcare professionals could implement immediately to improve eye safety in their workplaces.

TAKEAWAY (OUTCOME):

The key takeaway underscored the critical importance of fostering a robust safety culture within healthcare organizations. Key takeaways included the need for proper prescription practices and patient education to ensure medication safety, the implementation of pre-operative checklists and sterile techniques for surgical safety, and the use of protective eyewear and regular eye examinations to prevent eye injuries, as highlighted by Ms. Clerita Serrao. The importance of effective error reporting systems for continuous monitoring and improvement was also emphasized. The seminar highlighted advanced technologies, patient-centered care, and ongoing education as essential strategies for improving patient safety. Interactive sessions facilitated knowledge exchange, providing participants with practical insights to implement in their practices, reinforcing the collective commitment to prioritizing patient safety.

CONCLUSION:

The seminar successfully raised awareness about the critical importance of patient safety within healthcare settings. Through a series of insightful presentations and interactive discussions participants gained valuable knowledge and tools to enhance patient safety practices. The seminar emphasized the need for a strong culture of

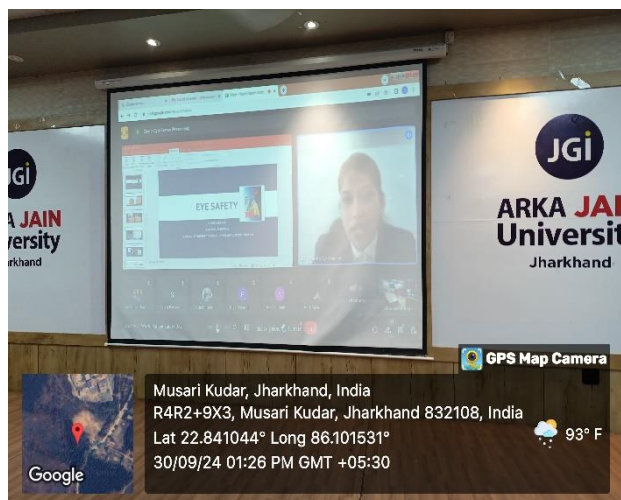


Fig 2: Speaker briefing about the event.

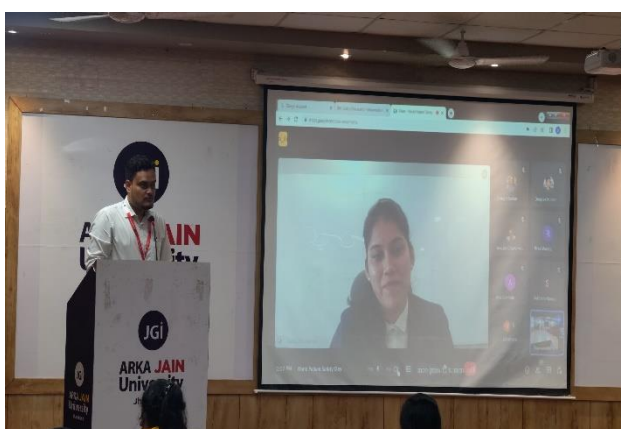


Fig 4: Mr. Sarbojeet Goswami, HOD, addressing the speaker Ms. Clerita Serrao

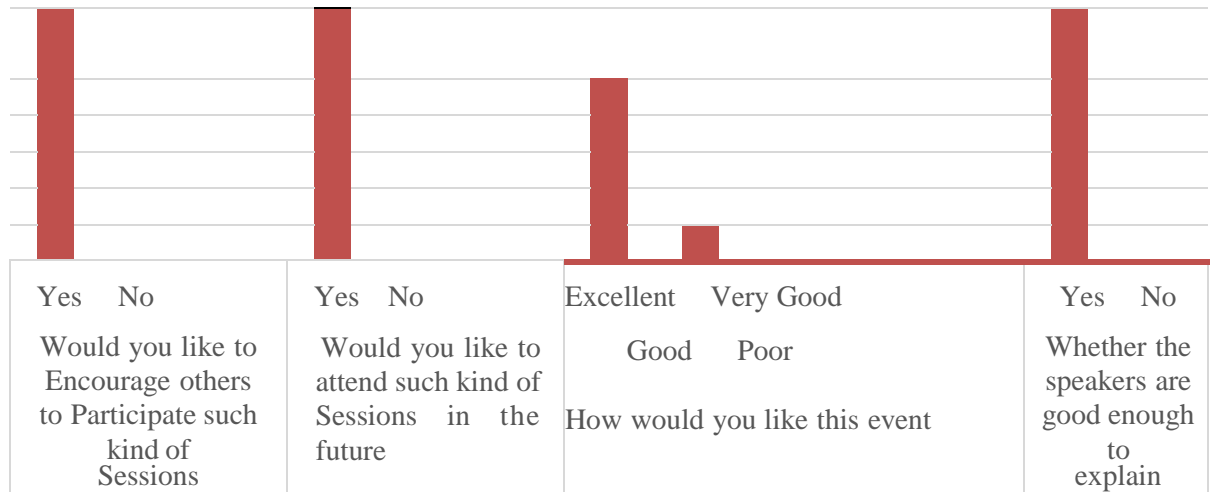
