The conference aims to explore how technological advancements are reshaping human experiences, ethics, culture, education, and society, while encouraging interdisciplinary approaches to address global challenges and promote sustainable, inclusive development. The aim of the conference has been as:

- Promote critical dialogue on the evolving relationship between humanity and technology
- Bring together diverse academic disciplines for collaborative exploration
- Examine how technological innovations impact ethics, culture, society, and human behavior
- Encourage solutions that prioritize sustainability, inclusion, and global well-being
- Foster interdisciplinary research to address contemporary global challenges
- Create a platform for scholars, practitioners, and students to share insights and innovations

DETAILS

Department of English & Department of Research, ARKA JAIN University (Jharkhand) in collaboration with Nucleus of Learning & Development (Gujarat) Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology (KIIT - Odisha) organised to bring together scholars, researchers, industry leaders, and policymakers to exchange ideas and insights on the interconnection between humanity and technology through a multidisciplinary lens. The conference emphasized innovation, research collaborations, and technological symbiosis for a better future.

- Pharmaceutical, Nursing & Medical Research
- Social Sciences and Humanities
- STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics)
- General Management and Interdisciplinary Research
- Law and Allied Themes

Keynote Speakers Included:

Eminent international and national scholars from IITs, NITs, and global universities (e.g., Japan, Bahrain, USA, Canada, Korea, Sri Lanka, Malaysia). Policy makers and industrial experts from government and private sectors.

Day 1 – Session 2 – Track 1: Pharmaceutical, Nursing & Medical Research

The session commenced with a keynote address by Dr. Awdesch Kumar Mishra, Department of Biotechnology, Yeungnam University, Gyeongsan, and Republic of Korea. His talk, titled "Salicylic Acid Biosynthesis and Metabolism: A Divergent Pathway for Plants and Bacteria," explored the contrasting mechanisms by which salicylic acid (SA)—a crucial molecule in stress physiology—is synthesized and metabolized in plants and bacteria. Despite sharing a common precursor, chorismate, the divergence in these pathways underscores evolutionary adaptations. Dr. Mishra emphasized the significance of these insights for advancing plant immunity research and microbial pathogenesis, with promising applications in biotechnology and agriculture. The session featured 13 paper

presentations from delegates across India, showcasing diverse and innovative research in pharmaceutical, nursing, and medical fields.

Dr. Biswaranjan Pradhan, Research Scientist at IIT Bhubaneswar, served as the Session Chair. In his concluding remarks, he lauded the dedication and quality of the research presented and offered constructive feedback to scholars. He gave special recognition to Debashis Mishra for his work on a sustained-release ocular film designed for the targeted delivery of an anti-diabetic drug to treat ocular inflammation. The novel approach enhances drug retention in the eye and reduces systemic side effects, marking a significant advancement in targeted drug delivery systems.

Day 1, Session 2, Track 2 --- Humanities and Social Science

Keynote speech of Dr. Thilp Kumar Moorthy, from Department of English studies, Faculty of Social sciences & Humanities, Malaysia addressed matters of today's classroom and took it forward to having a vision for global classroom and to be a global teacher every individual teacher needs to be ready to face future challenges in and outside the classroom. There were 31 papers presented by delegates from all over India. Wide spectrum of topics were read, researched and presented ranging from Literary studies, comparative literature, world literature, cultural studies, spirituality to language and literature teaching, technology and classroom and many other topics. Overall it was worth attending as most of the participants had a lot of learning to take home. Session Chair, Dr. Anuradha Kunda, Associate Professor from Dept of English, Malda College, Malda, West Bengal shared her concluding remarks for all presentations praising the hard work done by researchers and also gave her valuable suggestions to scholars pursuing research respective to their area of studies.

Day 2, Session 3, Track 3 ---STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics)

The session began with an insightful keynote address by Balram Dyal, Founder-Owner and Project Manager at DayaConex, NearSecure–Robinson, France. His talk, titled “The Basic and Fundamental of Cyber Security: The Understanding of Artificial Intelligence,” provided an engaging overview of foundational cybersecurity concepts and their integration with emerging AI technologies. The session featured six paper presentations

from delegates across India, reflecting innovative and interdisciplinary research spanning pharmaceutical, nursing, and medical sciences within the STEM domain.

Dr. Himanshu, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics and University Centre for Research and Development, Chandigarh University, Mohali, Punjab, served as the Session Chair. In his concluding remarks, he commended the researchers for their commitment and quality of work, while offering valuable guidance to the scholars. Notably, Neha Swati Baxla, Ph.D. Scholar from Ranchi University, presented her study on the ecotoxicological impact of CuO nanoparticles. Her research highlighted how these nanoparticles significantly alter soil physico-chemical properties and adversely affect the survival of the tropical earthworm *Drawida willsi*. The study underscores the urgent need to regulate nanomaterial use due to its potential ecological risks.

Day 2, Session 3, Track 4 --- General Management and Interdisciplinary Research

GENERAL MANAGEMENT The conference explored the interface between humanity and technology, emphasizing the multidisciplinary implications of digital transformation, hybrid work culture, AI, sustainable development, and leadership adaptability. Several distinguished academicians, researchers, and practitioners presented their insights on managing technological disruptions with a human-centric approach.

Dr S. Tripathy, Assistant Professor, College of Business Administration, University of Bahrain expressed on the rapidly evolving global landscape, general management can no longer operate in silos. Interdisciplinary research offers a powerful lens through which management can be reimaged: blending insights from technology, psychology, economics, and the humanities to foster innovation, resilience, and ethical leadership. By embracing collaborative inquiry and cross-sectorial thinking, we not only enrich managerial practice but also equip future leaders to navigate complexity with agility and purpose. This convergence of disciplines is not just a trend—it is the future of impactful, inclusive, and sustainable management.

The Session Chair, Prof. Jayesh Chakravorty addressed the dual nature of AI: promising yet threatening. Warned of job displacements and privacy risks through misuse of technologies like drones. Emphasized the ethical responsibility of research to serve humanity. There were technical Paper Presentations on

Organizational and Leadership Adaptability: Emphasized the cultural shift to hybrid work post-COVID-19; recommended proactive strategies to manage social isolation and productivity. Presented on adaptive leadership in times of technological disruption, focusing on emotional intelligence, empathy, and resilience. **Sustainability and Rural Inclusion:** Advocated for sustainable rural employment by aligning cultural competencies with business models. Discussed how eco-conscious parenting impacts sustainable financial decision-making at the household level. Explored CSR as a catalyst for social inclusion, aligned with SDG goals and national development targets. Highlighted the impact of AI in e-commerce, both in enhancing personalization and raising data privacy concerns. Focused on Green Supply Chain Management and the impact of digitalization

on Indian manufacturing Analyzed organizational energy in hospitals using a MICMAC study, identifying key enablers like leadership and participative decision-making. Public-Private Partnerships (PPP) for Infrastructure: Illustrated how PPP models can drive sustainable infrastructure through shared risks and private sector efficiency, citing Singapore and Andhra Pradesh case studies. Presenters highlighted practical frameworks, policy recommendations, and case studies for actionable change in management and societal contexts.

Day 2, Session 4, Track 5 --- Law and Other Potential Sub-themes

Today's keynote speaker for Technical Session Track 5 was Dr. Madhurima Dasgupta, Head of the Department of Gender Studies at Ashadi Wisdom Campus, Sri Lanka. The session was chaired by Dr. Mainan Ray, Associate Professor at Amity Law School, Amity University, Kolkata, and was ably moderated by Dr. Koyel Roy, Assistant Professor at Arka Jain University, Jharkhand. The session commenced with insightful discussions encompassing legal issues and emerging global themes, particularly focusing on Artificial Intelligence (AI), Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), and Human Rights. These topics spurred engaging academic dialogue and thoughtful reflection from both presenters and attendees.

The session chair, Dr. Ray, offered valuable feedback and appreciation for several of the research papers presented, while also providing constructive suggestions for others to enhance their scholarly contribution. Overall, the session was a great success, marked by enriching discussions, academic rigor, and active participation from all involved.

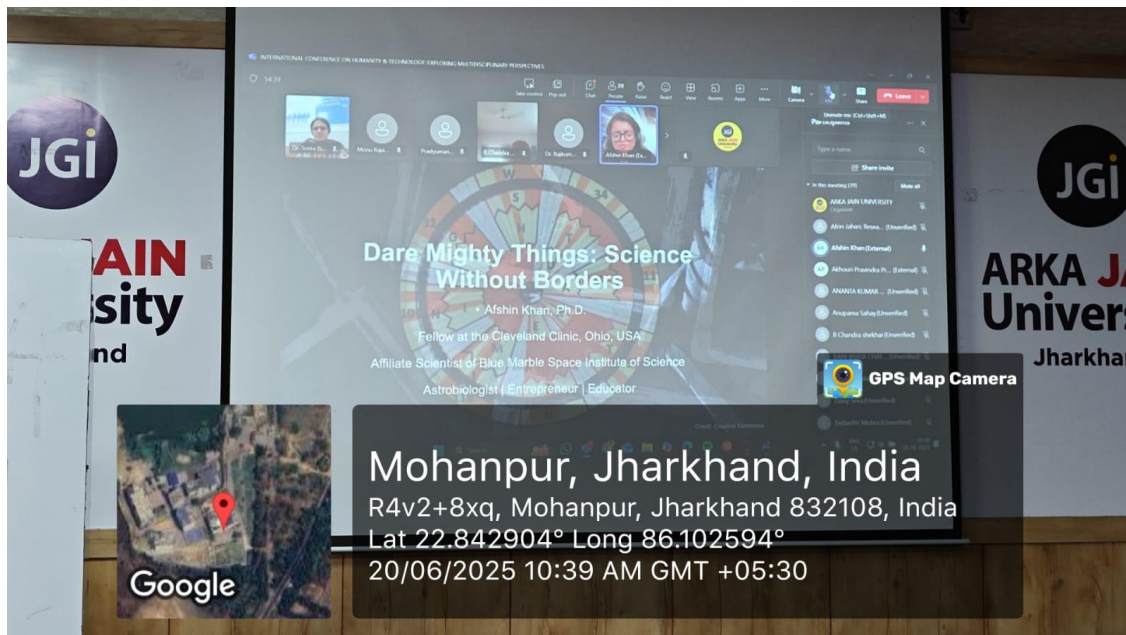


Fig.3- Presentation by the International Conference Keynote Speaker

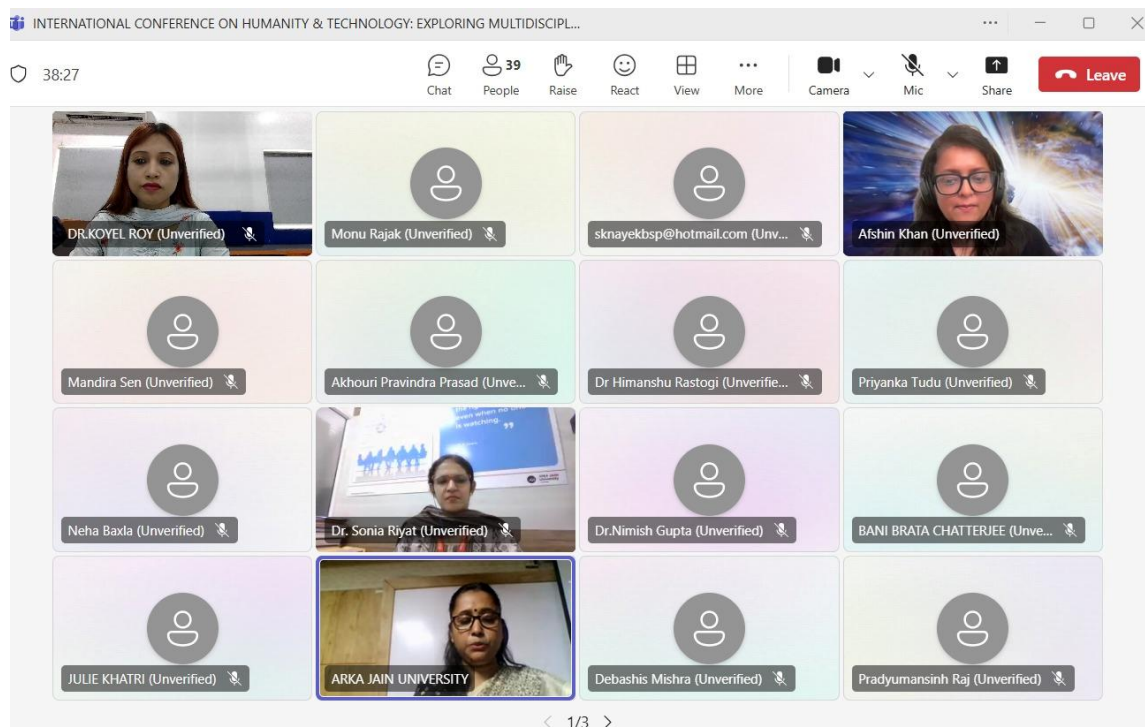


Fig.4- Discussion with the International Conference Keynote Speaker

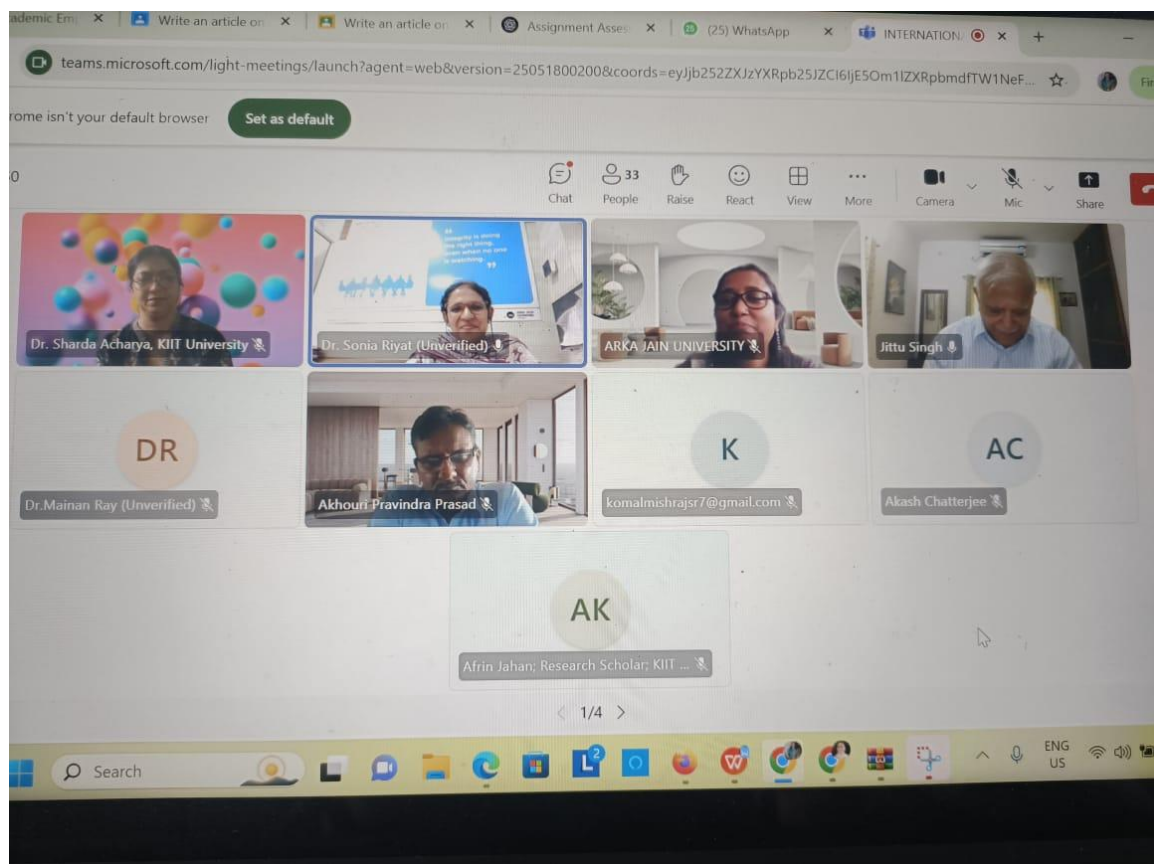


Fig.6-Feedback by the participants

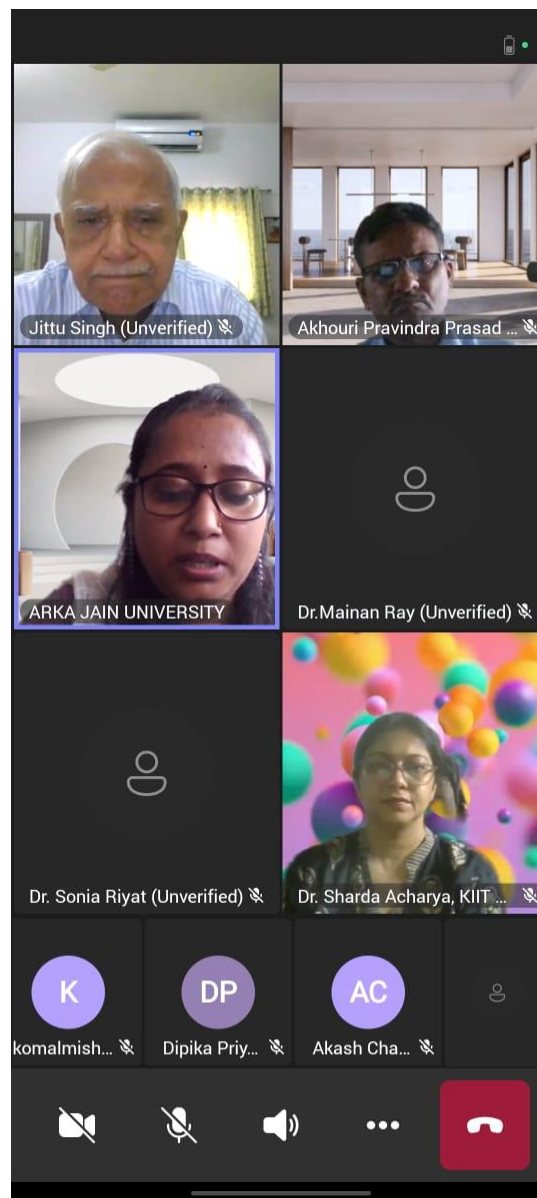


Fig.7- Prof Dr Jitu Singh at the Valedictory Session

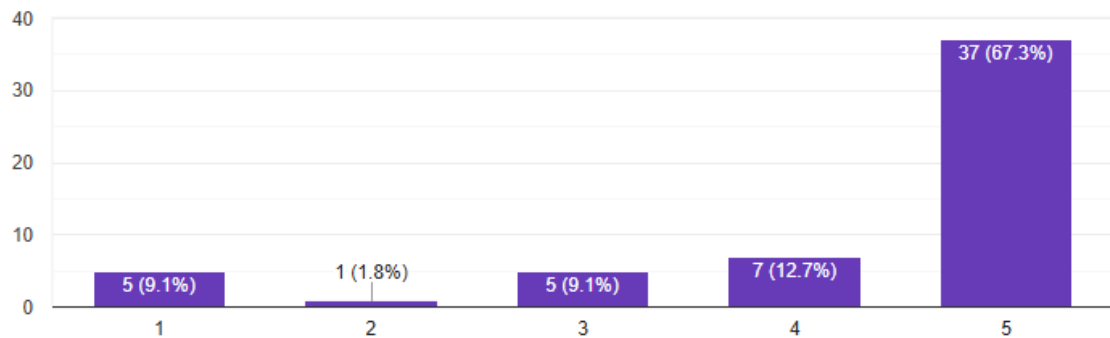

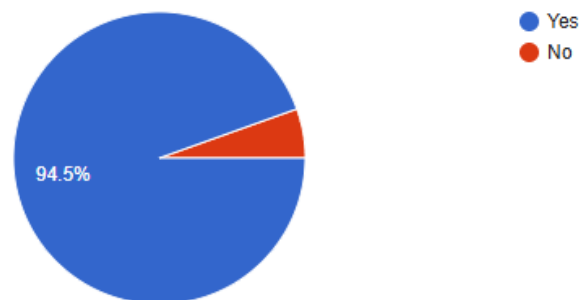

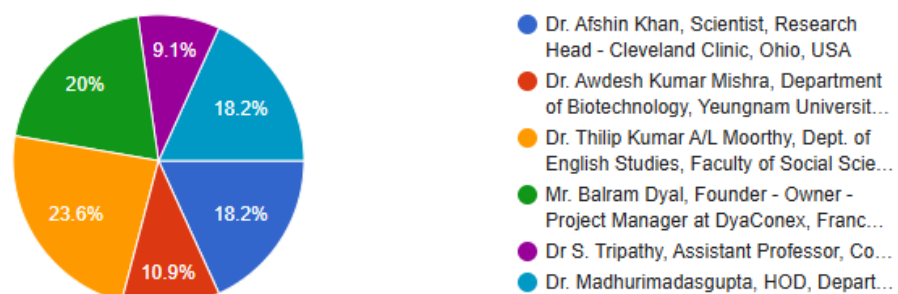

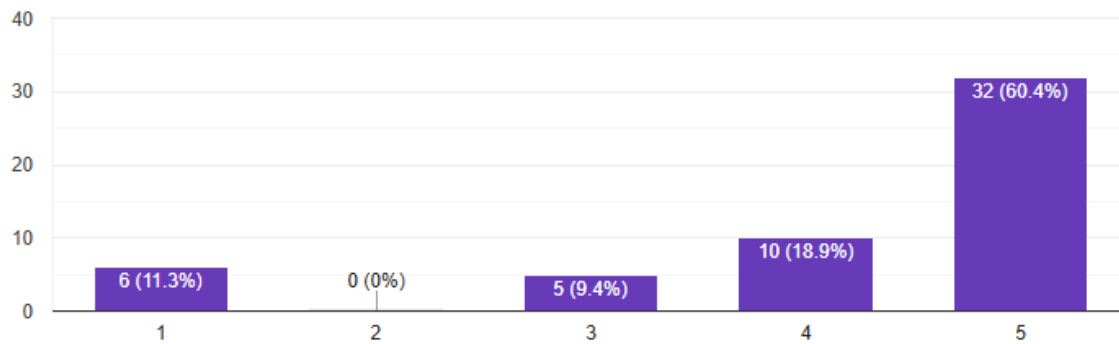

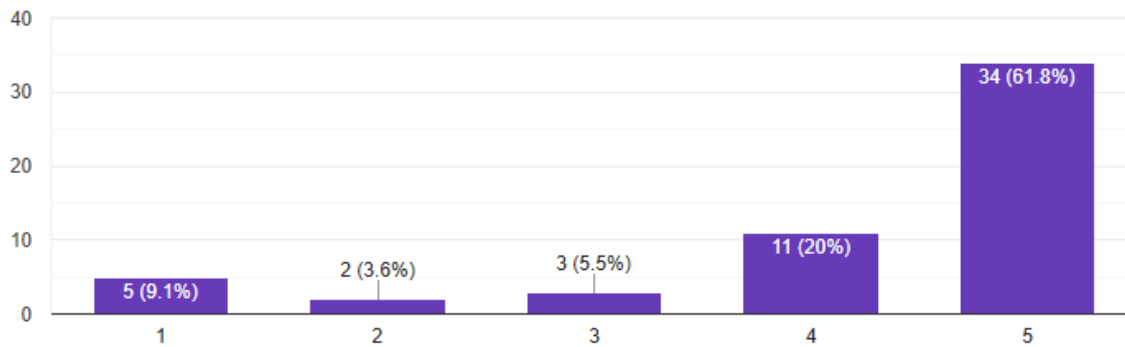

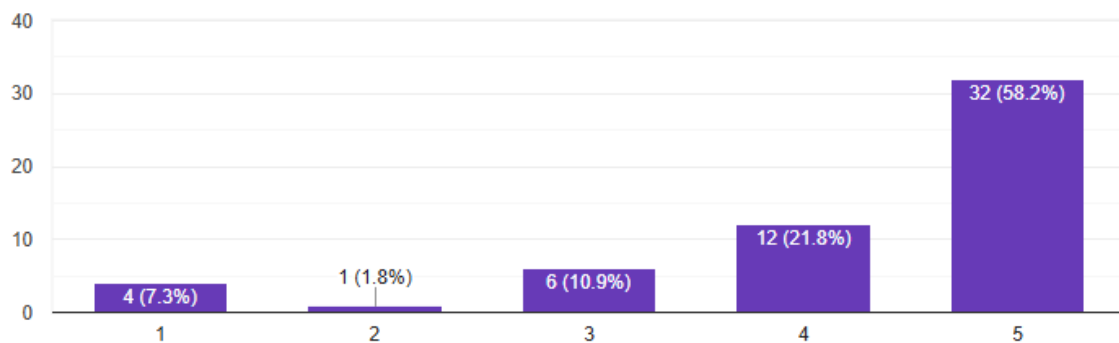
