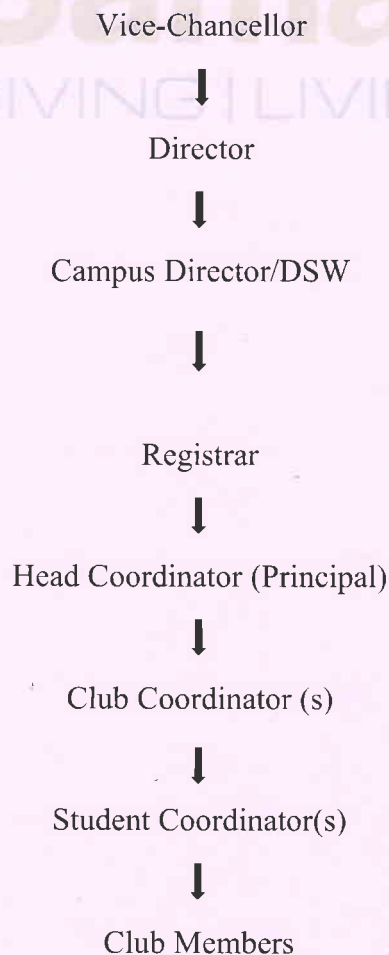
In a university a seminary experiment was conducted on a students of one batch.

Organizational Hierarchy: (Structure):



Functions

- Direct approach to the unfortunate/needy ones to meet their basic needs rather than to handing over to the institution head.
- Motivating to make changes by having positive attitudes.
- Acting as counsellor by helping the needy/distressed to bring effective changes in health behaviour which would enhance the over-all well-being.
- Providing direct help and disseminating information or raise awareness of health issues.
- Promotion of healthy lifestyle and advocacy for patients and providing health education.
- Seeking to initiate changes that positively affect people health and also seek to influence people to think and behave differently about their health and the factors contributing to it.
- Engaging in systematic investigation, collection and analyses of data for solving problems and enhancing community health practices.
- Organizing health check-up camps and awareness campaigns in and out of the campus.

Nomination/Membership and Functioning By-Laws

- The Club Coordinators among both faculty members and students would be nominated by the Principal of the School.
- Students' Club Coordinator will be changed every year.
- Teachers' Coordinator will be for two years or till his/her service, whichever is earlier.
- And by any means if any club members is found of fraudulent, misleading or misguiding in the name of club will be boycott with the penalty, which should recover the damage caused by him or her.

General Rules

- The students of the School of Nursing would be joining the Club as members or Coordinators.
- The frequency of meetings would be monthly or as when required in terms of activities/events/emergencies.
- By any means if the students within the club shows or get caught red handed with any immoral or mischievous behaviors / action, then the concerned mentor will be informed and the member will be terminated from membership with the penalty which should recover the damage caused by him or her.
- The Club would have the expectations for member behaviour, such as respecting the opinions of others and maintaining a professional attitude at all times.
The Club would be empowered to frame a set of bylaws to govern the operation of the nursing club as and when required including the purpose of the organization, membership requirements, officer duties, and rules for meetings and finances.
- The Nursing Club would plan and organize events and activities that align with the nursing club's goals and objectives. This would include guest lectures, volunteer work, fundraising, and social events.
- The Club would take notice of the University rules, regulations, norms and orders.
