




Fig. 14 Online Yoga Session for the new entrants

DETAILS: The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication conducted 6-Day Orientation Program for the freshers of 2024 batch at Arka Jain University Campus. Honourable dignitaries of Arka Jain University, Chairperson-Board of Management, Professor Dr. S. S. Razi, Dr. Amit Kumar Srivastav, Dr. Jasbir Singh Dhanjal and Dr. Angad Tiwary addressed the students and said'All the new students must attend the Induction and orientation programme attentively because it will help them to adapt to the new campus, batch mates and faculties, Rules and regulations, oriented towards higher studies.

DAY 1 (05.08.2024) of the Induction and Orientation Programme:

Activity 1: Inaugural of induction and orientation program in university campus

DAY 2 (06.08.2024) of the Induction and Orientation Programme:

A session on entrepreneurship development and value of education

A Women Entrepreneur, Ms. Julie Sahuwas invited as guest for the day. She motivated the young minds to generate interest and enthusiasm for entrepreneurship. They were encouraged for creative thinking, problem solving, troubleshooting and reflecting learning skills in the field of innovation. She shared her experience balancing his studies and entrepreneurship, and how it's possible to have a middle ground between the two. After this session a very inspiring speech for newcomers was given by Dr. Angad Tiwari, Campus Director and Dean Student welfare. Students got highly motivated and understood the value of education and also understood how Parents sacrifice for them.

Activity 2: A session on professional ethics

Then a session taken by Dr. Manoj Pathak about Professional ethics. Through different stories and by sharing his personal experiences students were inculcated with Virtues and ethics in Professional settings. They learned Moral ethical values and how sharing positive thoughts can create a chain of positive attitude in all persons around them. Students learnt that Ethical standards are crucial for professionals as they guide their conduct in their professional interactions. Ethics, from a philosophical standpoint, pertains to morality and how individuals behave in terms of right and wrong. Professional ethics encompass the moral principles that regulate professionals' behavior and decisions. It's important to recognize that these regulations may differ for each profession but are consistently rooted in fundamental principles and values.

Activity 3: A session on NSS, its objectives, NSS, its objectives and activities

A session regarding NSS was given by Dr. Rajiv Sinha. In this session Students got awareness regarding NSS Cell of the university. Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak and Dr. Rajiv Sinha the NSS Program Officer, talked about the NSS and its objectives along with the activities it does in terms of community service. Dr. Pathak informed the new students that the minimum devotion towards NSS to obtain the NSS Certificate is 240 hrs in 2 years, and everyone should know the NSS song. He said that NSS is about spreading awareness regarding the rights of a consumer, AIDS, Education, Clean Environment, so on. There was a briefing session about the NIC (National Integration Camp). He presented through power point presentation the history of NSS, how it started, and the work done by the volunteers. The objective of this session was to emphasize how the students can extend their service for the development of the community.

Activity 4: A session on code of conduct

A session on code of conduct to aware students about rules and regulation of the University was given by Mr. Sorbojeet Goswami. Students got aware about dress code and rules and regulation of the university. A message was delivered that Students are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct. After this a session was taken by Dr. Rupa sarkar showcasing Sports related activities in Arka Jain University.

Activity 8: A session on grievance and student support system

A session related to grievance and student support system was taken by Dr. Jyoti Khurana, Assistant Professor, Department of Biotechnology. Students got aware about student support system. During this session, students learned that the Grievance Redressal Cell aims to resolve valid issues and concerns of students regardless of their nature. Students are advised to feel free to approach the cell members or any of their other teachers, depending on their comfort level. It is important for students to understand that filing a complaint is a serious matter, and they should use this authority responsibly. However, the college assures students that all complaints will be handled with sensitivity and confidentiality once they are submitted.

Activity 9: Yoga session

In the evening an online session for Physical well being of students (Yoga techniques) was conducted. For this session Expert Yoga trainer Ms. Shubra Chakrobarthy was invited online for the session. Students also interacted with the expert yoga trainer, the expert yoga trainer gave various tips to the students for enhancement of concentration and focus. Students practiced different Yoga Processes and Pranayama techniques. Trainer also suggested the benefit of different Yoga techniques to the students. 


Fig 41. Mr. Ranjeet, NSS coordinator addressing the participants about NCC,NSS and Rotaract AJU.




