# KRANTI EK VEER KATHA EPISODE 11 "A STORY TELLING SESSION ON GREAT LEADER CAPTAIN MANOJ KUMAR PANDEY" TO COMMEMORATE QUIT INDIA MOVEMENT DAY

#### **OBJECTIVE:**

Organizing commemorative events for great leaders serves to educate students about notable historical figures, promote cultural awareness, and instill patriotic values. Such initiatives aim to inspire and motivate students, strengthen community engagement, and support their holistic development by celebrating India's rich heritage and paying tribute to national heroes.

#### **DETAILS:**

The School of Pharmacy organized a commemorative event to honour the indomitable spirit and supreme sacrifice of Captain Manoj Kumar Pandey, the Kargil War hero and recipient of the Param Vir Chakra, India's highest gallantry award. Held on 22nd August 2025 as part of the Quit India Movement Day observance, the program reflected the movement's ideals by drawing parallels between the sacrifices of freedom fighters during India's struggle for independence and the bravery of soldiers who continue to safeguard the nation's sovereignty.

The program began with a welcome address by Prof. (Dr). Jyotirmaya Sahoo, Dean, School of Pharmacy, who emphasized that just as the Quit India Movement in 1942 inspired unity and determination to free the country from colonial rule, the bravery of Captain Manoj Kumar Pandey and other soldiers during the Kargil War inspires today's generation to uphold values of courage, patriotism, and resilience.

This was followed by an inspiring storytelling session, "Kranti Ek Veer Katha: Episode 11," presented by students. Through their narration, they traced the journey of Captain Manoj Kumar Pandey, born on 25th June 1975 in Sitapur, Uttar Pradesh, who had dreamt of serving the nation from a young age. Commissioned into the 11 Gorkha Rifles, he displayed extraordinary bravery during the Kargil War (1999), leading his men in the assault on Khalubar in the Batalik sector. Despite grievous injuries, he pressed forward, motivating his troops and ensuring victory before making the supreme sacrifice. His





immortal resolve, expressed in his words— "If death strikes before I prove my blood, I swear I will kill death"—continues to inspire generations.

The storytelling session was marked with great enthusiasm and creativity, with students vividly narrating his acts of valor, his leadership, and the legacy he left behind. The audience was deeply moved, drawing inspiration from the parallels between India's freedom fighters and modern-day heroes who defend the nation's borders.

The event concluded as a solemn reminder that the sacrifices of our freedom fighters during the Quit India Movement and the bravery of soldiers like Captain Manoj Kumar Pandey are part of the same continuum of India's journey towards freedom, dignity, and self-reliance. A short video clip showcasing the life and heroic deeds of Captain Manoi Kumar Pandey was also presented, leaving the audience deeply inspired.
