# AMADUBI – PAYATKAR (SOON TO BE GI) VILLAGE VISIT IN ASSOCIATION WITH KALAMANDIR SAKSHAM SHG FEDERATION - KNOWING JHARKHAND - ART AND CULTURE

#### **OBJECTIVE:**

- Introducing students to the rich art, craft, and cultural heritage of Jharkhand, with a special focus on the traditional Payatkar painting (soon to be granted GI recognition).
- Creating awareness about indigenous art forms, tribal practices, and local traditions as part of experiential learning.
- Providing students with an opportunity to interact with artisans and self-help groups (SHGs) to understand sustainable livelihoods and the role of communitybased organizations.
- Encouraging appreciation of Jharkhand's cultural diversity through exposure to music, dance, painting, cuisine, and folklore.
- Strengthening the values of cultural sensitivity, inclusivity, and respect for traditional knowledge systems in the context of design, humanities, and creative learning.

#### **DETAILS:**

The School of Humanities (Department of English | Department of Fashion Design | Department of Journalism & Mass Communication) organized an educational visit for the students of Batch 2025 to Amadubi – Payatkar Village, situated in the Ghatsila subdivision of Jharkhand. The visit was conducted in collaboration with the Kalamandir Saksham SHG Federation.

The primary objective of the visit was to provide students with an opportunity to engage with Jharkhand's tribal art, culture, lifestyle, cuisine, and music through direct interaction and experiential learning.

A workshop on the traditional Payatkar painting was conducted by local artist Vijay Chitrakar, who elaborated on the distinctive features, painting techniques, and socio-





cultural significance of this heritage art form. Students also participated in practical sessions where they created paintings under the artist's guidance.

The cultural immersion continued with a musical session on tribal folk music, where students experienced live performances featuring instruments such as Mandar and Nagara. This session offered insights into the rhythm, expressions, and symbolic role of music in tribal life.

As part of the cultural exposure, students were introduced to Jharkhand's traditional tribal cuisine. They had the opportunity to taste authentic dishes such as Dhuska, Pitha, Rugra, and Churka-Bhaat, while also learning about the traditional preparation methods and nutritional significance of these foods.

Faculty members from the School of Humanities — Ms. Usha Kiran Barla, Dr. Shahin Fatima, Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, Mr. Anoop Kumar Singh, Mr. Shyam Kumar, and Ms. Urmila Thakur — accompanied the students and encouraged them to engage actively in the workshops, cultural dialogues, and interactive sessions with the community.

The visit to Amadubi – Payatkar Village proved to be an enriching academic experience. It not only deepened the students' understanding of Jharkhand's tribal heritage but also fostered values of cultural sensitivity, curiosity, inclusivity, and creative engagement. The exposure contributed significantly to their holistic learning as part of Humanities education.

#### **TAKEAWAY (OUTCOMES):**

- Exposure to the traditional Payatkar painting and hands-on learning with local artisans.
- Deeper understanding of the cultural and social significance of tribal art forms.
- Appreciation of tribal folk music and instruments as integral to Jharkhand's cultural identity.
- First-hand experience of tribal cuisine and awareness of traditional food practices.
- Strengthened interaction with artisans and community members, encouraging respect for indigenous knowledge systems.
- Development of cultural sensitivity, creative expression, and interdisciplinary learning essential in Humanities education.
