#### **OBJECTIVE:**

#### **DETAILS:**

The School of Humanities organized a warm and well-coordinated **Orientation Program** to welcome the incoming batch of students. The event aimed to familiarize new students with the academic environment, faculty members, university vision, and various cocurricular opportunities.





#### Day 1 - Inaugural Session

- **1. Welcome Note -** The program commenced at **10:00 AM** with a warm welcome by **Dr. Shahin Fatma**, Assistant Professor, and Department of English. Her opening remarks set a cordial and enthusiastic tone for the day's proceedings.
- **2.** Lamp Lighting & Floral Tribute At 10:05 AM, the dignitaries proceeded to the ceremonial Lamp Lighting and Floral Tribute, paying homage to Birsa Munda and Swami Vivekananda, symbolizing knowledge, inspiration, and leadership.
- **3. Welcome Dance -** A graceful **Welcome Dance** followed at **10:15 AM**, performed by students, showcasing cultural vibrancy and artistic expression.
- **4. Welcome Address Dr. Rahul Amin**, Head and Dean, School of Humanities, delivered the **Welcome Address** at **10:25 AM**, introducing the vision of the School and encouraging students to embrace their academic journey.
- **5. Address by University Dignitaries** At **10:40 AM**, university dignitaries addressed the gathering, offering insights into the institution's ethos and assuring students of a supportive learning environment.
- **6. Chief Guest Address** At **11:15 AM**, the **Chief Guest**, **Ms. Steffi AC**, Principal of Sacred Heart Convent School, Jamshedpur, delivered a motivational address. She emphasized the importance of holistic development and lifelong learning.

#### 7. Vote of Thanks

**Ms. Usha Barla**, Assistant Professor and Program Coordinator, Department of Fashion Design, proposed the **Vote of Thanks** at **11:30 AM**, acknowledging the contributions of all guests and participants.

Student Anchors presented the detailed **Orientation Program Schedule** at **11:35 AM**, guiding students on the upcoming sessions.

#### 9. Departmental Address

- At **11:55 AM**, **Dr**. **Rajkumari Ghosh** (English) and **Ms**. **Usha Barla** (Fashion Design) addressed the students, giving an overview of their respective departments and academic expectations.
- **10. University Introduction** At **12:20 PM**, **Dr. Rajkumari Ghosh** elaborated on the **University's Vision, Mission**, key events, clubs, and activities, encouraging students to participate actively.





- **11. Faculty Introduction** This was followed by a brief **Introduction of the Faculty** Members from the School of Humanities at 12:35 PM, enabling students to get acquainted with their mentors.
- 12. Break A short break was announced at 12:50 PM.

#### **Post-Break Activities**

Unveil - Talent Hunt and Photography Contest- Md. Usman Raza, Assistant Professor, Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, unveiled upcoming student engagement activities including a Talent Hunt and Photography Contest, fostering creative participation.

### **Closing with National Anthem**

The formal part of the event concluded with the **National Anthem**, instilling a sense of unity and patriotism.

#### Day 2

**Event 1**: A special Yoga, Health, and Wellness, Mindfulness Awareness Session was organized for the new students, focusing on their physical and mental well-being through Yoga techniques. For this session, Mr. Subham Kumar, Yoga Aerobic Fitness Instructor from Get Fit, Dance Yoga and Fitness Academy, Jamshedpur, was invited online as the expert trainer.

During the session, students were introduced to various techniques to enhance concentration and focus. They actively interacted with the trainer, followed by a one-hour Yoga practice that included different Yoga postures and Pranayama techniques. Mr. Subham Kumar also highlighted the benefits of these practices, helping students understand the importance of Yoga in maintaining overall health, mindfulness, and wellness.

- **Event 2**: An engaging Ice Breaker Session was organized by Dr. Shahin Fatma, and Ms. Urmila Thakur, Assistant Professors, School of Humanities. The session aimed to encourage students to speak confidently by introducing themselves and sharing their views on spot-given topics. All students actively participated and enjoyed the interactive activities. The session not only helped them build confidence but also created an opportunity to know each other better.
- Event 3: Mr. Shyam Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, briefed the students on the syllabus/schemes of study, Program Outcomes (POs), Program Specific Outcomes (PSOs), Course Outcomes (COs), semester promotion rules, internal assessment system, academic session, examination process, academic calendar, timetable explanation, and the commencement of classes.
- **Event 4**: A session was conducted by Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, Associate Professor, Department of English, on Professional Ethics and Human Values. Using real-life stories





and personal experiences, he emphasized the importance of virtues and ethical practices in professional settings. Students learned how moral values and positive thoughts can foster a chain of positivity, highlighting that ethical standards are essential in guiding professional conduct and decision-making. Dr. Pathak explained that while professional ethics may vary across fields, they are universally rooted in core principles of morality. He also discussed the significance of Human Values in personal and professional growth, encouraging students to imbibe qualities such as truth, honesty, loyalty, and peace values that uphold the inherent goodness of individuals and society. The session further helped students reflect on their identity, guiding them toward becoming responsible human beings.

In addition, Dr. Pathak also shared insights into the Indian Knowledge System and highlighted its relevance in shaping values and fostering holistic development. He explained how the traditional wisdom of India, rooted in philosophy, literature, culture, and spirituality, provides a strong foundation for ethical living and balanced decisionmaking.

**Event 5**: An enlightening session on the Code of Conduct was conducted by Dr. Rajkumari Ghosh, Associate Professor and Program Coordinator, Department of English, to familiarize the new students with the rules and regulations of the University. During the session, students were made aware of the University's dress code, rules, and general regulations. Dr. Ghosh emphasized that students are expected to abide by the Code of Conduct, maintain discipline in classrooms, and uphold decorum while interacting with fellow students, teaching, and non-teaching staff. She further advised the students to be conversant with all University rules, follow a decent and formal dress code, and demonstrate respectful behavior in all academic and co-curricular settings. The session proved to be highly productive and insightful, setting the right tone for students as they begin their academic journey at the University.

Event 6: The Department of Journalism and Mass Communication organized a Departmental Guest session. Dr. Shalini Prasad, Assistant Professor & Head of Department, Journalism and Mass Communication, Jamshedpur Women's University was invited as the esteemed guest speaker. Dr. Prasad delivered an engaging session focusing on valuable tips, career guidance, and strategies for achieving success in life. Her insights motivated students to develop professional skills, set clear goals, and work with dedication to excel in their chosen fields.

**Event 7**: An Introductory Session on Grievance Handling Procedure, Student Support System, and Student-Oriented Mechanisms was Organized by the School of Humanities Discipline Cell. An introductory session on the Grievance Handling Procedure, Student Support System, and Student-Oriented Mechanisms was conducted by Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, Associate Professor, Department of English, for the newly admitted students. The session aimed to familiarize students with the various support structures available at the University, ensuring that they are well-informed about the grievance redressal process. student welfare initiatives, and mechanisms designed to address their academic and nonacademic concerns. This initiative provided the students with a clear understanding of how to seek guidance, resolve issues effectively, and make the most of the support systems offered by the institution.





**Event 8**: An interactive session on "Curbing the Menace of Ragging" was conducted for the newly admitted students, followed by an engaging Anti-Ragging Slogan Writing Competition. The session was led by Ms. Urmila Thakur, Assistant Professor, Department of Journalism and Mass Communication. Through the session, students were sensitized about the harmful impacts of ragging, the legal implications, and the University's zerotolerance policy towards such practices. Ms. Thakur emphasized the importance of fostering a culture of respect, inclusivity, and mutual support on campus. The slogan writing competition further encouraged students to express their views creatively, spreading strong messages against ragging. The activity not only highlighted the students' awareness but also strengthened their commitment to maintaining a safe and welcoming environment within the University.

## Day 3

The third day of the orientation program by the School of Humanities, ARKA Jain University, held on 16th August 2025, began with a meaningful community initiative. At 8:30 AM, students and faculty members participated in a **fruit tree plantation drive** at Mohanpur Village. The activity, coordinated by Ms. Urmila Thakur (Assistant Professor, Journalism and Mass Communication), Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak (Associate Professor, English), and Ms. Manisha Singh (Teaching Assistant, Fashion Design), symbolized the university's commitment to sustainability. This was followed by an informative session at 9:45 AM by Mr. Prabhat Kumar, **Department of Examination.** He explained the functioning of the examination system, highlighting important processes, regulations, and student responsibilities. For many students, this session clarified doubts and set expectations, creating a sense of preparedness and accountability.

After a short campus tour and refreshment break, Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak introduced students to NCC, NSS, and Rotaract AJU at 11:00 AM. He underlined how these platforms build discipline, leadership, and a spirit of service. At 11:15 AM, Mr. Himanshu Sinha, **Dean, Training and Placement,** addressed students on career preparedness. He assured them of the university's support in bridging the gap between academics and industry, instilling confidence about future prospects.

At 11:30 AM, Dr. Rahul Amin, Head and Dean of the School of Humanities, sensitized students to Intellectual Property Rights. He stressed the importance of safeguarding creative and academic work, an area particularly relevant in today's knowledge-driven world. At 11:45 AM, Dr. Charu Wadhwa, Assistant Director, Centre for Capacity Building and Human





**Resource Development,** conducted an introductory session on grievance handling. Her talk reassured students that robust support mechanisms exist to address their concerns and challenges.

The day ended on an inspiring note with the "Seniors se Charcha- Alumni Speaks" session at 12:15 PM. Ms. Sneha Haldar (Fashion Design), along with alumni Anoushka Mitra (English) and and Abhirup Bhadra (Journalism and Mass Communication), shared personal journeys, lessons, and advice. Their words created a warm connection between current and former students, leaving the freshers motivated and optimistic. The program concluded with the National Anthem at 12:30 PM, encapsulating a day that balanced knowledge-sharing, guidance, and community spirit.

#### Day 4

The School of Humanities (Department of English | Department of Fashion Design | Department of Journalism & Mass Communication) organized an educational visit for the students of Batch 2025 to Amadubi – Payatkar Village, situated in the Ghatsila subdivision of Jharkhand. The visit was conducted in collaboration with the Kalamandir Saksham SHG Federation.

The primary objective of the visit was to provide students with an opportunity to engage with Jharkhand's tribal art, culture, lifestyle, cuisine, and music through direct interaction and experiential learning.

A workshop on the traditional Payatkar painting was conducted by local artist Vijay Chitrakar, who elaborated on the distinctive features, painting techniques, and socio-cultural significance of this heritage art form. Students also participated in practical sessions where they created paintings under the artist's guidance.

The cultural immersion continued with a musical session on tribal folk music, where students experienced live performances featuring instruments such as Mandar and Nagara. This session offered insights into the rhythm, expressions, and symbolic role of music in tribal life.

As part of the cultural exposure, students were introduced to Jharkhand's traditional tribal cuisine. They had the opportunity to taste authentic dishes such as Dhuska, Pitha, Rugra, and Churka-Bhaat, while also learning about the traditional preparation methods and nutritional significance of these foods.

Faculty members from the School of Humanities — Ms. Usha Kiran Barla, Dr. Shahin Fatima, Dr. Manoj Kumar Pathak, Mr. Anoop Kumar Singh, Mr. Shyam Kumar, and Ms. Urmila Thakur — accompanied the students and encouraged them to engage actively in the workshops, cultural dialogues, and interactive sessions with the community.

The visit to Amadubi – Payatkar Village proved to be an enriching academic experience. It not only deepened the students' understanding of Jharkhand's tribal heritage but also fostered values of cultural sensitivity, curiosity, inclusivity, and creative engagement. The exposure contributed significantly to their holistic learning as part of Humanities education.





## Day 5




Fig.28 - Alumni Speaks session by Alumni of Journalism and Mass Communication with Audience




Fig.30 - Campus Tour


