

OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the debate competition held on Constitution Day is to provide a meaningful, interactive, and intellectually stimulating platform where students can actively engage with the foundational principles of the Indian Constitution. Rather than merely learning about the Constitution as a historical document, this event encourages participants to explore its living relevance, its philosophical foundations, and its continuing influence on India's democratic structure, governance, and social progress. By participating in the debate, students gain an opportunity to deeply understand and appreciate the values of justice, liberty, equality, and fraternity upon which the nation stands. This event is designed to promote comprehensive awareness of constitutional rights and duties, while encouraging students to reflect on their own role as responsible citizens. It inspires them to analyse and interpret constitutional concepts within current societal contexts, enabling them to express informed perspectives on themes affecting modern India such as digital freedom, public health, governance, social justice, and ethical citizenship. Through structured debate, students learn to research, evaluate, and logically present arguments supported by facts, legal provisions, ethical dimensions, and real-world observations. Beyond academic enhancement, the competition strengthens essential life skills including critical thinking, persuasive communication, confidence building, decision-making, and respectful rebuttal. It provides a constructive environment where differing viewpoints can be shared and challenged with maturity, tolerance, and dignity, fostering a culture of meaningful democratic dialogue. Ultimately, the debate aims to build a stronger sense of civic responsibility and national consciousness, helping students develop pride in the constitutional framework that protects every citizen's rights while ensuring harmony and order in society. By connecting constitutional ideals to real-life challenges and experiences, the event inspires young minds to become informed, engaged, and proactive members of the nation—individuals who uphold constitutional values not only in thought, but also in their actions and contributions to society.

DETAILS:








The Debate Competition in observance of Constitution Day 2025 was successfully conducted by the Department of Optometry, School of Allied Health Science, Arka Jain University on 26th November 2025 at 12:00 PM in F Block, Room 654. The event took place under the national theme “Hamara Samvidhan Hamara Swabhiman,” emphasizing the dignity, strength, and significance of the Indian Constitution in shaping the nation. Students registered for the program through the provided link, and the session began with a brief introduction on the relevance of Constitution Day, followed by a welcome address from faculty members highlighting the importance of democratic values, fundamental rights, and responsible citizenship. The competition featured two highly relevant and contemporary topics — “Fundamental Rights in the Digital Era” and “Right to Health Including Eye Care.” Participants spoke passionately and confidently, presenting arguments supported by facts, legal references, ethical viewpoints, and real-life examples. The discussion on the impact of digital transformations on constitutional rights such as privacy, expression, and access to information generated active engagement, while the segment on the Right to Health created awareness about the importance of equitable healthcare systems and the recognition of eye care as an essential public health component. The audience actively listened and applauded compelling arguments, and the judges evaluated participants on clarity, articulation, rebuttal strength, analytical depth, and overall presentation. The event concluded with constructive feedback from the judges and faculty, acknowledging the commendable efforts of all participants and emphasizing the need for students to remain informed, responsible, and constitutionally aware citizens. Certificates of participation and achievement were distributed, marking the event as a memorable, educational, and meaningful celebration of Constitution Day. The program successfully encouraged critical thinking, enhanced public speaking skills, strengthened understanding of constitutional values, and inspired students to uphold democratic principles with pride and responsibility.

TAKEAWAY (OUTCOMES):

The takeaway message from the event is that the Constitution of India continues to remain deeply relevant in the modern era, serving as a guiding force for justice, equality, liberty and accountability while adapting to emerging societal needs and technological transformations. The debate encouraged students to recognize that their constitutional rights come with equally important duties and responsibilities, especially in a world where digital interactions, access to information and healthcare practices are rapidly evolving. Through the discussions, participants gained a deeper sense of how fundamental rights such as freedom of speech, privacy and the right to health must be interpreted and protected within contemporary contexts, including the digital world and the healthcare system. The event highlighted that responsible use of digital platforms, ethical expression and awareness of legal protections are essential components of being

a digitally literate citizen. Similarly, the exploration of health as a fundamental right broadened perspectives on equitable access to services such as vision and eye care, reinforcing that public health is not a privilege but a constitutional promise. Overall, the experience inspired students to value debate, dialogue, and democratic participation, fostering a sense of pride, awareness and accountability. The message that remained with participants is that every citizen, especially the youth, has an important role in preserving, respecting and strengthening constitutional values, ensuring that the spirit of democracy continues to grow stronger with each generation.
