VISIT TO COIN MUSEUM – SAKCHI (JAMSHEDPUR)

OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the visit to the Coin Museum, Jamshedpur, was to offer them an opportunity to experience India's numismatic heritage firsthand and understand how coins serve as historical documents that narrate cultural, political, and economic transitions across time. The visit aimed to broaden students' academic perspectives by linking literary studies with material culture, symbolism, and historical narrative. It was also to enhance students' critical thinking, observational skills, and appreciation for interdisciplinary learning through exposure to authentic artefacts.

DETAILS:

The visit to the Coin Museum, Jamshedpur, was conducted under the guidance of Dr. Shahin Fatma, with Dr. Rajkumari Ghosh serving as the convenor of the program. Students from the B.A. English Department participated enthusiastically in this educational excursion designed to blend academic knowledge with real-world observation. At the museum, students explored an extensive collection of ancient, medieval, and modern coins, including rare pieces from various dynasties such as the Mauryas, Guptas, Mughals, and British India. They also viewed commemorative coin series, minting tools, and historical artefacts. The museum guide explained the significance of symbols, motifs, dates, and inscriptions, helping students interpret how each coin reflects the political authority, cultural identity, and economic conditions of its era. Students actively interacted with the museum staff, took notes, and deepened their understanding of India's historical evolution through numismatics.

TAKEAWAY (OUTCOMES):

The visit provided valuable academic and intellectual takeaways for the students, who gained a deeper appreciation of how coins function as narrative mediums that preserve the stories of different dynasties and cultures. They realized that coins are not just economic instruments but also rich historical texts that reveal societal values, artistic traditions, and cultural transformations. The experience strengthened their analytical and interpretive abilities, encouraging them to think critically about the connections between literature, history, and material culture. The visit was academically enriching and broadened their understanding of how everyday objects can narrate compelling stories of the past.
