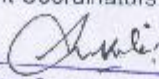
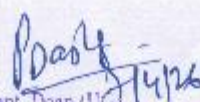

OBJECTIVE: The primary objective of a mentor-mentee meeting for undergraduate (UG) students in a university is to create a collaborative platform where faculty members and parents can discuss the academic progress, attendance, behavior, and overall development of students. It aims to strengthen communication between the institution and students, ensuring that they are aware of their performance, strengths, and areas requiring improvement. Such meetings also help in identifying academic or personal challenges faced by students and allow for timely guidance and support. Additionally, the interaction promotes a sense of shared responsibility in shaping the student's career, enhancing discipline, motivation, and holistic development, ultimately contributing to better academic outcomes and professional growth.

DETAILS: The Mentor-mentee Meeting at the undergraduate level serves as an important academic and developmental interface between the university and the parents. Although university students are considered independent learners, parental involvement still plays a crucial role in shaping their academic journey and overall personality development. One of the key objectives of the MENTOR-MENTEE is to provide a comprehensive review of the student's academic performance. Faculty members share insights regarding internal assessment marks, class participation, assignment quality, and examination outcomes. This helps parents understand whether their ward is meeting the expected academic standards or requires additional support. Another important objective is to discuss attendance and discipline. Regular attendance is directly linked with better academic performance and understanding of concepts. Through MENTOR-MENTEES, parents are informed about attendance shortages, behavioral issues (if any), and the student's attitude toward studies, enabling timely corrective actions.

The meeting also focuses on identifying academic and psychological challenges faced by students. Many UG students experience stress, confusion regarding career choices, peer pressure, or lack of motivation. MENTOR-MENTEE provide a platform where such concerns can be openly discussed, and appropriate mentoring or counselling strategies can be suggested. Furthermore, MENTOR-MENTEE aim to strengthen communication and collaboration between mentee and the institution. Career guidance is another significant aspect of MENTOR-MENTEE. This ensures that students are aligned with industry expectations and future goals. Lastly, MENTOR-MENTEE promote the holistic

development of students by discussing their involvement in co-curricular and extracurricular activities such as seminars, workshops, sports, and clubs. Encouraging participation in such activities helps in building confidence, leadership skills, and overall personality development.

TAKEAWAY (OUTCOMES): The Mentor-mentee Meeting highlights that continuous communication between parents and faculty is essential for improving student performance and overall development. It reinforces the idea that even at the undergraduate level, involvement plays a supportive role in monitoring academic progress, attendance, and discipline. The discussion typically reveals the importance of early identification of academic gaps and personal challenges, allowing timely intervention through mentoring, counselling, or extra academic support. It also emphasizes that students perform better when there is a coordinated effort between home and institution. Another major takeaway is the need for students to maintain regular attendance, actively participate in classes, and stay consistent with assignments and internal assessments. The meeting also underlines the significance of career planning, skill development, and participation in co-curricular activities to ensure holistic growth.
